The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda (MSU) is recognized as one of the premier institutions of higher learning and research in the country. Since its inception in 1949, the University has demonstrated a keen interest and a commitment to the sustenance and promotion of an environment, favourable to the growth and development of an academic excellence - a commitment that forms a part of the rich legacy of the institution.

Educational institutions which preceded the Maharaja Sayajirao University and which went on to forming a part of its foundational legacy, included the "Baroda College", one of the oldest centers of learning in Western India, founded in the year 1881 by His Highness Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad III. The enlightened ruler in the year 1909 established the "Kala Bhavan". His Highness Maharaja Pratapsinhrao Gaekwad pursued the idea of establishing a University and on the recommendation of the committee, the Government of Baroda, in its order No. (R) 169-39 dated 21st February 1949, decided to establish a Residential University at Baroda. The bill for establishment of the University was passed by the Legislative Assembly and received the assent of His Highness Maharaja Pratapsinhrao Gaekwad on April 29, 1949, and the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda came into existence on April 30, 1949.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, a State University with English as its medium of instruction is a premier unitary residential University, established on 30th April, 1949 recognized by Government of India under the Indian Universities Act, 1958 and is accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council with 'A' Grade with CGPA of 3.16 in the year 2016. It has one main and 6 satellite campuses, spread over 274.81 acres of land. The University comprises of 111 Departments under the umbrella of 14 Faculties, 3 Constituent Colleges, 8 Institutions and 13 Centers of Specialized Studies, wherein more than 37,000 students pursue higher studies under the care and supervision of more than 1100 highly qualified and experienced teaching staff.

The University has 16 Hostels, Health Centre, Sports Union Pavilion, Convocation Ground, Press and Stationery Unit, Guest House as well as other academic and administrative units spread across the campus. Besides, there are 9 Multipurpose Auditoriums, 8 well equipped Seminar Halls, 2 Open Air Theatres, an Amphitheatre, a Play Box, an Art Gallery, an Arboretum, a Botanical Garden, several lecture theatres and conference rooms and an Archeological Museum having collection of Harappan unicorn seals, holy relics of Lord Buddha, Toraman, terracotta Buddha images etc. The University has an Astronomical observatory set up in 1939 to promote the field of Science, which holds an 8-inch refractor telescope.

The University offers a wide range of academic programmes from early childhood to Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate levels including Ph.D., with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for students to select value added subjects of their interest, other than Grant-in-Aid academic programmes. The University also offers innovative Science and Technology programmes in the field of Cell and Molecular Biology, Nanotechnology, Petroleum Geology, Medical Biotechnology, Bioinformatics. Disaster Management, Embedded Systems, Packaging Engineering, Welding Technology etc through some cutting edge research centers like Centre for Biotechnology, Prof. Bharat Chattoo Genome Research Centre, Centre for Molecular Genetics, Cluster Innovation Centre, Centre for Excellence in



Polymer, Siemens Centre of Excellence for industry automation. Other than that, a number of socially relevant job and knowledge oriented academic programmes are also on offer by the University like M.E. in Microelectronics & VLSI Design, Master of City Planning, Post-Graduate Diploma in Strategic Human Resource Management, P. G. Diploma in Food Service Management, Bachelor and Master of Design. University also offers Certificate Courses in Temple Management, Diet and Healthy Living, Sports Nutrition, Fitness Management etc.

The University interacts extensively with the Industry and the civil society in the curriculum development and updation process. The University has signed MOU's with International Universities/Institutes like University of Cambridge, University of Laval, University of Stuttgart, University of Cornell, Ithaca, University of South Carolina, Keio University etc for the exchange of students and teachers which adds to the enrichment of curriculum from global perspective.

The Centre for Life Long Learning and Extension offers 29 short term and 22 long terms courses on Ancient Indian studies, Art and craft, Human Social Development, Language Proficiency, Computer Education, Hotels / Cookery, Personal Grooming etc.

Smt. Hansa Mehta Library is the Central Library in addition to 13 constituent libraries and 25 Departmental libraries with over 8 lakh books/periodicals and above 14000 digitized Dissertations/Theses. It has the single largest air-conditioned reading room which can accommodate about 1600 readers at a time and the library is open to the readers 14 hours a day.

The All India and Central Services Training Center conducts classes for preparation of UPSC, State PSC and SSC pattern examination and provide guidance for exams like NDA, CDS, IB, SHO, Police, RBI and other banks. The MSU has one of the largest Hostel Campuses in western India with 12 Boys' and 4 Girls' Hostels with all modern amenities. Hostel admission is an online process from application to allotment of room to the students.

The University Health Centre provides routine medical treatment to the students and staff of the University and has a physiotherapy unit, a Pathology Laboratory and Marg Counselling Centre.

The University has a magnificent union pavilion overlooking a large ground which has an athletic track, a cricket ground, hockey and football fields, two tennis courts, two basketball courts, four volleyball courts, two kabaddi grounds, malkhamb, a kho-kho ground and a handball court and a swimming pool.

The University has developed student digital life-cycle through MKCL. When students are admitted in their first year, they get a unique 14-digit Permanent Roll Number (PRN) which continues forever. The University has also adopted Online Admission Application System and every year it gets an admission query of nearly 45,000 students across the globe. The University introduced reforms in the examination system and all faculties are brought under MSU Examination Portal (MEP) system. The University fees' collection and other record keeping system is online which is of great help to the students. The recruitment process of academicians and non-academicians is also through online job portal. The University has started student facilitation centre from where students get all academic and research enquiries taken care at one place. The Student's Facilitation Centre provides the information related to admissions, courses, application forms, generation of examination forms & hall tickets, results, counselling and queries related to students' life cycle in the University.

Career and Counseling Center and Placement Cell looks after the placement and also imparts training for facing interviews, coordinating with the agencies for arranging the placements drive. The



Faculty of Social work and Faculty of Management Studies have achieved 100% placement and average 65% placement is the normal trend on and off campus. The Directorate of Students' Welfare disburses scholarships to the students of economically weaker sections.

An Incubation Centre and Start Up Centre set up at the campus encourages the spirit of innovation and provides a platform to the youth for exploration and implementation of innovative ideas and their conversion into start-up ventures. Some of the academic, social δ technical events to name few Prerna, Paramarsh, Footprints, BBA Baazigar, Cyberia, Yuvaantas etc. are initiatives exclusively planned and managed by the students. They have gained prominence and popularity not only in the state but across the country as well. Office of Alumni affairs' Cell of the University also engages in compiling information about various alumni associations, initiating monthly interacting sessions in various departments across the university, Coordinating for Reunions, Collecting details of eminent alumni, Alumni Registrations..etc **Xplore MSU** – A Heritage Walk initiated for the first time in the history of the University gained interest amongst large public. Institute of Leadership and Governance has also been established in University which primarily focuses on training and transdisciplinary aspects of leadership as well as on studies on good governance structures, practices and processes which is highly essential today. The University promotes students' participation in various processes and therefore conducts students' election and students regularly participate very actively to develop their leadership qualities.

All these aspects make The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda one of the leading Institution in the area of Higher Education and Research.

Education is that beam of light which shines bright even through the darkest of times. Providing education has always been considered as a noble profession. To remove the bondage associated with humanity in form of superstitions and blind-faith, education is an apt tool. Education providing institutes take up this responsibility of providing knowledge and empowerment to the people to free them from all these bondages. They exuberate immense positivity and excellence around them. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is one such pioneering premiere institute. It believes in fostering the love of beauty, goodness and intellectual curiosity within each of its stakeholders. With this strong belief, we began working afresh on this year's Annual Report for the year 2016-2017.

The preparation and presentation of the Annual Report of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is the resultant outcome of critical reviews and reflections on Academic, Research, Extension, Curricular, Co-Curricular as well as Social Outreach, and various other activities of the university. It gives me great pleasure to present before the Senate the 68thAnnual Report of the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, for the year 2016-2017 which has been prepared under thoroughly revamped format with multiple innovative features. It highlights the important developments and significant achievements of the 14 Faculties along with 03 Constituent Colleges, 07 Centers, 02 Institutes, 14 Constituent Libraries, 16 Hostels, Health Centre, Sports Pavilion, 05 Multipurpose Auditoria, Sadhana Printing Press and Stationery Unit, Green Guest House of our University and various other academic and administrative units, spread across the 07 Campuses of our university. This year, following the path-breaking methodology of the previous year, the entire data for the Annual Report has been collected and compiled online under indigenously developed software called as ARMS. By making this possible, we have achieved a milestone in e-Governance of our university and a step further towards innovative initiatives of our Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendrabhai Modi's call for 'Digital India".

The University has made substantial progress over the past one year. It is my great pleasure and privilege to share with you all that the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has been now accredited with 'A'Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in November 2016. It was indeed a great moment of pride for all of us!

I am also happy to share that our University appeared in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Ranking in 2017. From India, THE considered 67 institutions, out of which 42 were ranked. It is the only university from the State of Gujarat to feature in this list. In the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2017, Faculty of Technology Engineering of the MS University of Baroda was placed in the first 100 in the Engineering category. Many faculties and Departments of the M S University of Baroda were also ranked among the top in other ranking systems. Faculty of Social Work was ranked 4th among Top Social Work Colleges in India by the Survey conducted by Outlook Magazine.

With great pride, I would like to inform you that the Central Government of India has selected the Faculty of Social Work for Establishing Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Chair for undertaking activities such as organizing Conferences; Seminars Workshop and Training programs mainly for weaker section of society. Faculty of Social Work has received Rs. 12,20,000/- from the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India under the "Pradhan MantriYuva Scheme" under which the Faculty can enroll 250 students for developing entrepreneurs. Faculty of Management Studies [FMS] was again ranked in A8 Super League Category in Pan India B-School Survey conducted by Business Standard in the year 2017. Dept. of Computer Engineering, Faculty of Technology and Engineering has acquired recognition as the 'Best ICT Enabled Academic Institute of the Year' awarded from A.S.S.C.H.A.M. and G. R. Foundation, in March 2017. Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science of our university has been honored amongst the 15 Universities from around the world, chosen to receive scientific equipment from Seeding Labs' 2017 under its 'Instrumental Access program', Boston, MA, USA. The University participated in 'Times Education Expo-2017' and 'Grand Education Fair' at Ahmadabad. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has become the Regional Centre for the 'Virtual Labs' Project Initiated by MHRD under the National Mission on Education through ICT conducted by IIT Bombay.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda promotes research in applied and basic areas through various timely initiatives. This year, recognizing the felt need of conduct translational research in the cutting edge areas of health and life sciences by bringing together researchers in different areas of Science and Technology, we have established the Institute of Interdisciplinary Studies (Research and Extension). At present, the institute has three international collaborative projects and it is in the process of bringing international collaborators to work together and also to mobilize research funding. The research initiatives and mechanisms which are in place in the university led to the high quality, relevant and visible research being carried out in the University. This is evinced from the high volume of research publications (628) in peer-reviewed journals by the researchers of the university in the year 2016-17.

In the same duration of time, H-index of the University increased to 74 (from 69 in 2015-16), i-10 jumped to 1616 and the total number of citations went up to 6300. The average impact factor of the publication in the year 2016-17 was 2.6. In the last five years, 53 articles were published in journals with impact factor higher than 5 (there are only 15 in all the previous years). The researchers of the University were able to bring in 50 research projects worth Rs. 10.4 Crores in the year 2016-17. During the same time duration, there are 90 ongoing research projects worth Rs. 25 Crores, and 36 projects worth Rs. 6.4 Crores were completed.

Research and Consultancy Cell (RCC) set up to promote collaboration between academia and industry acts as a liaison between the university and private or Industrial funding agencies to undertake sponsored and consultancy projects. The R & C Cell had received 48 research proposals this year for financial assistance and out of which 29 projects were provided financial support by the university from its own funds.

The culmination of any research work is the outcome of that in the form of any new policy or analysis and also in the form of invention. Three Indian Patents has been awarded to our researchers during the current year. Five teachers of the University have been awarded copy right for the invention of the products through research work.

We are constantly evolving the curriculum in consultation with all the stakeholders. Few new innovative academic programs were introduced in the year 2016-17 with an interdisciplinary approach.



The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has an iron clad policy for creation and enhancement of infrastructure to promote a good teaching-learning environment. It focuses on self-sustainable green infrastructure and energy efficient buildings. One of the initiatives given prime importance is the use of renewable energy in the university. Solar Power Plants providing more than 350kW power has been installed. The Guest house of the university has been converted into a Green Building and was bestowed with the Environmental Excellence Award. The University has received infrastructural funds of the tune of Rs. 11 Crores in the last 3 years from RUSA and Rs. 5 Crores from Government of Gujarat During this duration Sports Authority of Gujarat had sanctioned Rs. 7.8 Crores to build an Indoor Stadium. The University looks forward to providing 24x7 Internet access to faculty members and students in the hostel through Optical Fiber and WiFi Networking. All the faculties across the university are now connected to the university WiFi network.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has a Network of Libraries to cater to the needs of students and teachers. The library network consists of 01 Central Library and 13 Constituent Libraries. Students and teachers can access ejournal and books at the Central library through this network for seamless teaching-learning process.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Barodain a big way is promoting e-Governance initiatives in its academic administration. One of the most important initiatives is Digital University (DU) Frame work for the maintenance of Digital Life Cycle of each of the students. It allows the students to have a single Permanent Registration Number [PRN], which is used throughout the stay of the student in the university. It is used in issuing books from the library to hostel admission.

Another key initiative is improvisation of administrative processes, 'Work Flow Management System' which is a web based portal to maintain a consistent watch over the movement of essential documents in the process of decision making. The university has an e-Complaint Redressal mechanism meant for the students. An interesting e-Initiative of the university is MSU Examination Portal [MEP] for examination related activities with minimum use of paper. The admission process as well as hostel allocation is completely online. The recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff is also completely online process. Online Human Resources Management System (HRMS), which is an effective tool to unify, control and maintenance of employee life cycle is also in use. Annual Report Management System (ARMS), which is Centralized Repository Software for maintaining and updating of all Academic/Research activities, is one ofthe recent most innovative initiatives successfully implemented by our university.

During 2016-17 The Maharaja Sayajirao university of Baroda organized 20 Workshops, 32 Seminars and 30 Exhibitions.

In the area of Sports also the university has proven its mettle. Girl's Basket Ball Team secured 1st Position in School & College League Tournament and won cash Award of Rs. 5 Lakhs. Students of Department of Physical Education participated in All India Wrestling Inter University Competition at Haryana in February 2017. The sports team of university had won the State College League Championship organized by the Government of Gujarat.

At present, the University is in a transition stage from the old school of teaching to the new school of teaching which involves On-Line Courses, Virtual Labs, Flip Class Room Concept and Learning Using Smart-Phones. The university has already installed ICT infrastructure to implement these concepts across the campus. The first step in this direction has already been taken in the form of installation of SWAYAM

Prabha DTH Channels in each of the faculty of the university. Many of the traditional class rooms are now IT-enabled with Smart Boards and Multimedia facilities. Next step will be offering of On-Line Courses as well as providing logistic support for development of the On-Line Content by the faculty members. The university will be developing a dedicated studio to promote use of Information Technology in near future. Another step will be inclusion of Virtual Labs in the Curriculum. ICT-enabled Studios and class rooms will be used for conducting interactive sessions between the experts in various disciplines within India and abroad with students of the university. This will lead to direct exposure of students to the global pool of expertise.

I would like to express special thanks to our beloved Hon'ble Chancellor, Mrs. Shubhangini Devi Gaekwad, for her continual guidance to us. We also appreciate support and efforts of the Senate and Syndicate Members, Deans, Principals, Heads of Institutions, Directors of various Units and Cells, Heads of Departments, Faculty Members, University Officials, Ministerial Staff, Alumni, and above all our beloved students and research scholars towards achieving the set goals. I also thank the Convener and members of the Annual Report Committee for their constant efforts to improve the quality and contents of the annual report.

Whether through providing equality education, research development or by providing the workforce with skilled employees, we play a distinctive role in furthering the state's as well as the nation's social, cultural, business and economic development. We embrace this obligation and are committed to ensure that our activities benefit the communities with which we serve and engage.

While preparing for the Annual Report, this year, I thought it worthwhile to contemplate over the purpose for all this hard work and how can it be used to make a difference to the society. It is rightly said that any progress is based on dreams and requires change. With this constant thought in mind, this year, we have put in our best efforts in bringing out this 68th Annual Report. The Annual Report, this year, highlights some of the prominent researches and academic achievements, along with the other major administrative reforms and educational activities carried out during the year 2016-2017. It provides an opportunity to reflect on the significance of academic researches, educational achievements and effective governance gained by The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda and the contribution that The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda makes in assisting the city's transformation into a knowledge-base. The significant academic growth of our University is an indicator of the inherent effectiveness of this great institution and of the excellence of the human resources.

This year, The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has been now accredited with 'A' Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in November 2016. This year, our University appeared in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Ranking in 2017. From India, THE considered 67 institutions, out of which 42 were ranked. Ours is the only University from the State of Gujarat to feature in this list. These are two very important milestones our University has crossed this year. Self-belief is extremely important for progress. Sincerity is a sign of such self-belief. The ability to accept, evaluate, adapt and adopt new ideas is very essential. Keeping this in mind, our University has put all efforts to generate ideas among students and teachers during the year. The University has received considerable grants during the year from various agencies for development and research activities. To enhance the teachers' and researchers' potential, various faculties and institutions have organized and conducted various regional, national and international seminars and conferences during the year. A good number of research projects have been approved with generous grants in each case. Many teachers from various faculties have been granted financial assistance for participation in conferences and seminars, abroad. During the year 2016-17, many of our faculties and institutions have done a remarkable job and under the able leadership of Prof. (Dr.) Parimal Vyas, Honourable Vice-Chancellor of our University, we have made an effort in collecting entire information for Annual Report online again this year. The details about the decisions of Board of Studies and Faculty Boards, The Opinions, Suggestions and Feedback from Alumni, Parents and Students, the awards and felicitation of individual teachers, the PhD information and unique features of every academic institution have also been incorporated in the Annual Report as special phenomena. We have also made very important progress in the area of Alumni Cell with special emphasis on Alumni activities and their online registrations. This year we have also added all Temporary Teaching staff and their research and extension activities in our report, which will be very useful to all of us. We also, continuously, keep on organizing intramural and extramural activities through various faculties and departments. National Service Scheme (NSS), various



academic cells and institutions has incessantly worked for the benefit and overall development of the students of our University, throughout the year.

In terms of infrastructural advances, Solar Power Plants providing more than 350kW power have been installed. The Guest house of the university has been converted into a Green Building and was bestowed with the Environmental Excellence Award. The Sports Authority of Gujarat had sanctioned funds to build an Indoor Stadium in the University.

The students of the University showed their inclination of research and innovation, which is very well evident from 125 doctoral degrees awarded during the year 2016-17. A total of 263 Gold medals were awarded to meritorious students this year. To promote health and fitness and to encourage sports activities, the university always encourages and supports students' participation. Career counselling centres for students have also been developed and all Students' activities have been positively emphasized by all faculties. Meeting with the industrial requirements, the students have also been trained to secure placement with various Government, Private and Multinational Companies. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has also strengthened its ties with the various industries in and around the city of Vadodara as well as the state of Gujarat and the nation at large. The University also very actively participated in the Switch Global Expo-2016, The VCCI Exhibition-2016, Vibrant Gujarat Exhibition 2017 and Grand Education Fair organized by Knowledge Consortium of Gujarat (KCG) and received greater leverage and position as a premiere academic institute.

The Hansa Mehta Library of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has added 6,168 books making the total collection of books to 8,71,882 during the year 2016-17.

The University has introduced several progressive steps towards digitization of administrative processes and other technological advancements. We have efficiently managed students' cycle from admission to obtaining mark sheets in courses where they have sought admission. An innovative e-Initiative of the university is MSU Examination Portal [MEP] for examination related activities with minimum use of paper. The recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff is also completely online process. Online Human Resources Management System (HRMS), which is an effective tool to unify, control and maintenance of employee life cycle is also in use.

Apart from managing students requirements, various Staff Development Programs have also been organized in the year 2016-17 for our Teaching as well as Non-teaching Staff.

I wish that The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda reaches the pinnacle of excellence and proves to be a model University to other universities not only in the state or the country but on the global front as well.

It is my great pleasure and privilege to share with you all that the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has been now accredited with 'A'Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in November 2016. It was indeed a great moment of pride for all of us!!

I am also happy to share that our University appeared in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Ranking in 2017. From India, THE considered 67 institutions, out of which 42 were ranked. It is the only university from the State of Gujarat to feature in this list. In the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2017, Faculty of Technology Engineering of the M S University of Baroda was placed in the first 100 in the Engineering category.



Many faculties and Departments of the M S University of Baroda were also ranked among the top in other ranking systems. Faculty of Social Work was ranked 4th among Top Social Work Colleges in India by the Survey conducted by Outlook Magazine. With great pride, I would like to inform you that the Central Government of India has selected the Faculty of Social Work for Establishing Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Chair for undertaking activities such as organizing Conferences; Seminars Workshop and Training programs mainly for weaker section of society. Faculty of Social Work has received Rs. 12,20,000/- from the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India under the "Pradhan Mantri Yuva Scheme" under which the Faculty can enroll 250 students for developing entrepreneurs. Faculty of Management Studies [FMS] was again ranked in A8 Super League Category in Pan India B-School Survey conducted by Business Standard in the year 2017. FMS is the only Government run B-School in Gujarat State that has achieved this milestone.

Dept. of Computer Engineering, Faculty of Technology and Engineering has acquired recognition as the 'Best ICT Enabled Academic Institute of the Year' awarded from A.S.S.C.H.A.M. and G. R. Foundation, in March 2017. Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science of our university has been honored amongst the 15 Universities from around the world, chosen to receive scientific equipment from Seeding Labs' 2017 under its 'Instrumental Access program', Boston, MA, USA. The University participated in Times Education Expo-2017' and 'Grand Education Fair' at Ahmadabad. The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has become the Regional Centre for the 'Virtual Labs' Project Initiated by MHRD under the National Mission on Education through ICT conducted by IIT Bombay.

Research Initiatives and Outcomes:

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda promotes research in applied and basic areas through various timely initiatives. To promote and maintain high quality research, various mechanisms are in place. It includes Department Research Committee, Post Graduate Council, Research and Consultancy Cell, Office of International Affairs, Technology Transfer Cell, Central Instrumentation Facility and Specialized Research Centers. It embraces the mantra of Research through interdisciplinary approach and considering this initiative, we have established the Institute of Interdisciplinary Studies (Research and Extension) in the year 2017. The institute was constituted to conduct translational research in the cutting edge areas of health and life sciences by bringing together researchers in different areas of Science and Technology. At present, the institute has three international collaborative projects and it is in the process of bringing international collaborators to work together and also to mobilize research funding.

The research initiatives and mechanisms which are in place in the university led to the high quality, relevant and visible research being carried out in the University. This is evinced from the high volume of research publications (628) in peer-reviewed journals by the researchers of the university in the year 2016-17.

In the same duration of time, H-index of the University increased to 74 (from 69 in 2015-16), i-10 jumped to 1616 and the total number of citations went up to 6300. The average impact factor of the publication in the year 2016-17 was 2.6. In the last five years, 53 articles were published in journals with impact factor higher than 5 (there are only 15 in all the previous years). All these numbers show the quality, relevance and visibility of the research conducted in the University.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is renowned for academic and research excellence both at home and abroad. Considering the academic stature of the University, the University Grants Commissions allotted a towering grant of Rs. 24 Crores for the XIIthfive year plan period, and I am happy to share with all of you that the university has been able to utilize bulk of the grants received also from various other funding agencies like DST, DBT, AICTE, DAE etc. who have continued to provide financial assistance to the University through their flagship programs as well as has continued to provide research support to several departments of our university.

At present, there are 04 Departments supported through the DSA scheme, 05 Departments supported through the DRS program, 03 Departments supported through FIST Scheme, 02 Departments are supported through CAS Scheme, 01 Department each supported by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MJSE) and under Dr. Ambedkar Chair Program. The total worth of the Departmental Projects sanctioned in the year 2016-17 was Rs. 5.25 Crores.

Development Report



Other than this in the year 2016, the university was awarded with Phase-II of PURSE Scheme worth Rs. 12 Crores. With their excellent track record, the researchers of the University were able to bring in 50 research projects worth Rs. 10.4 Crores in the year 2016-17. During the same time duration, there are 90 ongoing research projects worth Rs. 25 Crores, and 36 projects worth Rs. 6.4 Crores were completed.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is continuously encouraging the young teachers especially from Humanities and Social Sciences to undertake research and is also providing financial assistance to them through Research and Consultancy Cell (R&C). The R & C Cell had received 48 research proposals this year for financial assistance and out of which 29 projects were provided financial support by the university from its own funds.

Our university is always a profound destination for researchers from India and abroad, especially in the areas of Health and Life Sciences, Archeology, Family and Community Sciences, and Fine Arts. Services of Young Research Associates, Kothari Fellows, Emeritus Professors, UGC Faculty Recharge Programme Fellows are used to support teaching and research activities of the university.

The culmination of any research work is the outcome of that in the form of any new policy or analysis and also in the form of invention. Three Indian Patents has been awarded to our researchers during the current year. Five teachers of the University have been awarded copy right for the invention of the products through research work.

Consultancy:

Research and Consultancy Cell (RCC) set up to promote collaboration between academia and industry acts as a liaison between the university and private or Industrial funding agencies to undertake sponsored and consultancy projects. Our Four teachers had bagged Industrial Research Projects, 19 Industrial Consultancy assignments and 37 teachers were awarded individual consultancy work during the year. The university researchers were able to bring in more than Rs. 2 Crores through 63 Consultancy Projects in the year 2016-17.

Academic initiatives and New Academic Programs:

We are constantly evolving the curriculum in consultation with all the stakeholders. In the past five years various faculties have conducted revision of the syllabus keeping in mind the future issues. Few new innovative academic programs were introduced in the year 2016-17 with an interdisciplinary approach. To illustrate few ones, the Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Technology & Engineering started Masters of Engineering in Computer Sciences and Masters in Aerospace Engineering.

All India & Central Services Training Centre prepares the students of the University for appearing in Civil Services Examination conducted by UPSC. Other than the regular programme and 5 years AICS-Civil Service Programme, Center has also started "Prelim Focus Crash Course" this year.

Department of Indian Classical Music (Vocal), Faculty of Performing Arts started a Certificate Course on Indian Classical Vocal Music. It is a matter of joy to share, that Faculty of Social Work has received the status of 'Center for Excellence-in Corporate Social responsibility' in the year 2016. Further, they will become a Hub Center for UNICEF "Social Changes Programme". The faculty also has a clinic- Prof Indubhai Shelat Child guidance clinic and a project on child help line-named as 'Child line 1098'.

Institute of Leadership and Governance, which is an unique initiative to train future leaders, has launched a Certificate Course on 'Life and works of Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad-III' in the year 2017.

Teacher's Achievements:

Teachers of the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda have bought many honors to us. To illustrate few ones, Prof. Bhavna Mehta, Faculty of Social Work had received a Fellowship under the umbrella of "Peace Project Programme-2017" held in Israel, which is indeed is a moment of pride to the University. Prof. Sirimavo Nair, Dept. of Foods and Nutrition have been nominated as an expert in the scientific panel of Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI-GOI) for food fortification initiatives, February 2017. Dr. Ambika Patel, Associate Professor, from Museology Dept has received fellowship to conduct research at National Museum Berlin, Germany.



Additionally, she is the secretary (India chapter-ICOM-India) - International Council of Museums under UNESCO-2017. Dr. Sanskriti Mujumdar, Associate Professor, Faculty of Tech. & Engg. had received "Udgam Women's Achievers Award" on International Women's Day on 9th March 2017. Dr. Hemagini Gandhi, Assistant Prof, from Dept of Food and Nutrition has been selected as a National resource person for Food, Nutrition, Health, Wash (FNHW) under The National Rural Livelihood Mission, March 2017. Dr. Swati Parnami, Assistant Prof, Dept. of Foods and Nutrition, Faculty of Family and Community Sciences had received 'Pratima Kaushik (Clinical Dietetics)' award in 49th National Conference organized by Indian Dietetic Association, September 2016. I am happy to share with you that Dr. Prashant Murumkar, Faculty of Pharmacy was selected for Prestigious 'Indian Council of Medicinal Research International Fellowship Award', under the Young Biomedical Scientist Category. To the delight of all of us, Prof. M. N. Parmar, of Faculty of Social work was selected as Chairman of the Baroda Chapter of Indian Society for Training and Development, New Delhi.

Student's Achievements:

Our students have also bought laurels to the university with Mr. Lalji Rathod; Ph. D. Scholar of Faculty of Pharmacy is being selected for Pradhan Mantri Doctoral Research Fellowship. Mr. Swapnil Mahajan, PhD. Scholar of Faculty of Technology & Engineering was awarded the prestigious exchange fellowship by German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). Ms.Vinita Nigam, PhD student, Dept of Foods and Nutrition, received 'Swarna Padak' from Indian dietetic association, Mumbai chapter for her studies in Experimental Nutrition October 2016. Ms. Mausmi Shah, Masters student, Dept. of Food and Nutrition had won C. Gopalan Shrikantia Gold Medal for her research emphasizing upon the Nutritional requirement for Pregnant Women, May 2016. Our students were also involved in taking entrepreneurial steps with Mr. Parth Jaiswal and Mr. Pujan Rathod, students of Faculty of Technology and Engineering joining hands to start a company and developing an 'Application' for educational purpose.

Eco-friendly devices are need of the hour; Mr. Kunal Patel of Applied Arts Department, Faculty of Fine Arts had developed an 'Eco-Friendly Pencil' and also patented his unique creation, which is very commendable. Ms. Vinita Nigam, Ph. D. Scholar, Department of Foods and Nutrition had received Gold Medal Award on 'Experimental Nutrition'. Shri Sharadbabu Pillai, Ph.D. Scholar, Department of Physics, Faculty of Science won prize of the "Best Poster Award" in an International Conference themed on Vibration Spectroscopy' at Lucknow. I would like to congratulate Ms. Zalak Parikh, Ph.D. scholar, of Department of Zoology for being awarded the prestigious IBRO-APRC Exchange Fellowship. Students of BCA programme, Faculty of Science has developed a Software Optical Character Recognition (OCR) to reduce the effort of typing to convert handwritten or printed text in to Machine-Encoded Text. Ms. Hardi Joshi, Faculty of Social Work was awarded First Prize in Poster Making Competition organized by National Service Scheme (N.S.S.).

Extension Activities:

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda is involved in Extension and Outreach activities in a big way. Department of Preventive and Social Medicine, Faculty of Medicine is actively involved in providing various trainings for the Government of Gujarat for various health cadres including Medical Officers and Paramedical Staff like NVBDCP National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme, IYCF Infant and Young Child Feeding Practice, Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health, HIV/AIDS etc. One of the key aspects of The Women's Studies Research Center are the outreach programs and networking within and outside the University. These outreach programs consists of 'Celebrations of International Women's Day, Focus Group Discussions, Skill Enhancement Programs, Preparation of Posters and Leaflets, Specialized Talks, Field Action, and Information Dissemination'.

The University Health center conducts regular Thalassemia screening program in collaboration with Indian Red cross society. In addition to this, Faculty of Social Work is highly committed to all issues and concerns of our society and extensively involves itself in Community Outreach Programs by regularly conducting Awareness Programmes on Thalassemia and in conducting Thalassemia tests for our students in collaboration with Indian Red Cross Society. They conduct Voter Awareness Programs on a regular basis. Faculty of Performing Arts had put efforts to spread message of Environmental Protection through performance of traditional form of Gujarati Bhavai. Faculty of Technology & Engineering had conducted the National Social Responsibility Initiative through the highly appreciated program called "Prerna", which is a constellation of Sports and other events for 'Divyangs' of the society.

Development Report



Around 600 young minds from schools across Vadodara participated in the various competitions organized by Dept. of Computer Science, of Faculty of Technology & Engineering along with Computer Society of India (Vadodara Chapter) during the "Computer Day" Celebrations. Faculty of Journalism & Communication along with city based Theatre Group 'Triveni' had organized a stage Gujarati Play 'Bandh Barne' based on the very important issue of trauma and trials of acid attack victims aimed also to highlight the legal provisions in the Indian Penal Code for victims of such attacks. The PG Diploma students of Food service management of the Foods and Nutrition Department, participated as interns and coordinated along with staff of 'Surya Palace' for 'Switch Global Expo' conducted between 6th-10th October, 2016.

Infrastructure Development:

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has an iron clad policy for creation and enhancement of infrastructure to promote a good teaching-learning environment. It focuses on self-sustainable green infrastructure and energy efficient buildings. One of the initiatives given prime importance is the use of renewable energy in the university. Solar Power Plants providing more than 350kW power has been installed. The Guest house of the university has been converted into a Green Building and was bestowed with the Environmental Excellence Award. The University has received infrastructural funds of the tune of Rs. 11 Crores in the last 3 years from RUSA and Rs. 5 Crores from Government of Gujarat During this duration Sports Authority of Gujarat had sanctioned Rs. 7.8 Crores to build an Indoor Stadium.24x7 Internet access to faculty members and students in the hostel through Optical Fiber and WiFi Networking. All the faculties across the university are now connected to the university WiFi network. In the First Phase, 5 faculty of the university were connected to WiFi network by the installation of 900 routers. In the second phase rest of the university campus was connected to the WiFi network by installing additional 960 nodes.

Library Facilities:

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has a Network of Libraries to cater to the needs of students and teachers. The library network consists of 01 Central Library and 13 Constituent Libraries. Students and teachers can access e-journal and books at the Central library through this network for seamless teaching-learning process.

Administrative Reforms and e-Governance Initiatives:

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Barodain a big way is promoting e-Governance initiatives in its academic administration. One of the most important initiatives is Digital University (DU) Frame work for the maintenance of Digital Life Cycle of each of the students. It allows the students to have a single Permanent Registration Number [PRN], which is used throughout the stay of the student in the university. It is used in issuing books from the library to hostel admission. Another key initiative is improvisation of administrative processes, 'Work Flow Management System' which is a web based portal to maintain a consistent watch over the movement of essential documents in the process of decision making. The university has an e-Complaint Redressal mechanism meant for the students. An interesting e-Initiative of the university is MSU Examination Portal [MEP] for examination related activities with minimum use of paper. The admission process as well as hostel allocation is completely online. The recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff is also completely online process. Online Human Resources Management System (HRMS), which is an effective tool to unify, control and maintenance of employee life cycle is also in use. Annual Report Management System (ARMS), which is Centralized Repository Software for maintaining and updating of all Academic/Research activities, is one of the recent most innovative initiatives successfully implemented by our university.

Start-Up Activities:

The Entrepreneur Development initiative is at the heart of the university. Start-up and Incubation Cell was formed in the University to promote and nurture entrepreneurship. The Start-up Cell of the University was awarded Rs. 2 Crores by Directorate of Technical Education, Government of the Gujarat. A wide range of different programs have been conducted by the Start-up Cell in sensitizing and familiarizing the students with the processes involved in entrepreneurship, mentoring them and connecting the potential candidates with the industry. In one such program, Faculty of Technology & Engineering along with Baroda Beat and Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, jointly organized 'Start-up Boot Camp' in the March 2017.



Training and Placement Cell:

Employment of the students is the top priority of the university. The primary objective of Training and Placement Cell is to help in getting more employment opportunities for the students particularly in general stream. The Cell has prepared a database of companies, who would be interested in placements in the respective fields. It conducts regular campus placement drives.

Regular employment and Orientation drives are conducted by various faculties. In one such event, Faculty of Commerce conducted largest ever Orientation and Industry Screening Programme in which 1700 students had participated. Polytechnic College too had conducted Campus Recruitment Drive wherein 140 students received placement offers. Cent per cent campus placement happens in Faculty of Social Work and Faculty of Management studies. In Faculty of Technology & Engineering, 460 students were placed through campus drive in the year 2016-

Career and Counseling Cell:

The Career and Counseling Cell is primarily required to counsel the students in matters related to their career. It also helps the students to acquire skills related to employability aspects. Almost all the faculties of the university were involved in the activities related to the Cell. More than 1000 students attended different sessions on Life Skills and Communication Skills. Some motivation sessions too were taken by the Coordinator in various departments of the faculties. Resource persons from the Corporate Sector, Consultant Organizations, Non-Government Organizations, Media and University took a large number of sessions. The cell conducted various programs involving resource persons from corporate houses and industries. The programs focused on different career related topics including Behavioral and attitude issues, preparation of resume, Group Discussion Skills, etiquettes and manners to face Interviews, Language Skills, Personality Development, Entrepreneurship, Presentation and Report Making Techniques.

Seminars, Conferences and Exhibitions:

During 2016-17 The Maharaja Sayajirao university of Baroda organized 20 Workshops, 32 Seminars and 30 Exhibitions. The Office of Corporate Affairs had organized many Workshops, Industrial Visits, and Management Games to prepare the students of the University to the corporate world. It had also participated in Switch Global Expo-2016, one of the largest Electrical Expos in the country and organized a Panel Discussion on "Small Business: Social Responsibility-Prospects & Challenges" at the VCCI Exhibition-2016. Department of Dramatics, Faculty of Performing Arts had organized Workshop on "Improve Theatre' with the help of German Artist in April 2016. Department of English, Faculty of Arts had organized a Workshop called "Films", in September 2016. Department of Physics, Faculty of Science organized a Workshop on Entrepreneurship for Scientist and Engineers in India', in September 2016. Workshop named 'Self-Defense for Adolescent Girls and Women' was conducted Women's Studies Research Centre, in June 2016. Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Technology & Engineering had also organized a seminar entitled "Climate Change Adaption - Issues and Challenges: (CCAIC-2016)" in December 2016. A Seminar on Advance Computing and Communication was organized by Department of Computer Science and Engineering, Faculty of Technology & Engineering in February 2017. Faculty of Education and Psychology organized a seminar on 'Educational Sustainability of the Disadvantaged: Path Ways to Success' in March 2017. The University also organizes Exhibitions. Department of Architecture organized 'Creative Study Stool Exhibition' in July 2016. The students have exhibited Garment and Jewelry inspired from Greek Culture in Textile Illustration' organized by Institute of Fashion Technology in July 2016. Artwork of Abhisek Narayan Verma (Recipient of Purshottam Annual Merit Award in the Academic year 2013-2015) was organized by Faculty of Fine Arts in September, 2016. "Tribute to Padmavibhushan K. G. Subramanium", 7thAnnual Exhibition was organized at Faculty of Fine Arts, on 3rdSeptember 2016. 'Food and Nutrition Priorities-From Evidence to Action' (National Conference) Department of Food and Nutrition, was organized by Faculty of Family and Community Science jointly with UNICEF (Gujarat), Indian Dietetic Association, Nutrition Society of India on 5th September 2016. A National level seminar on 'Inborn errors of Metabolism and New born screening' along with a half day work shop on 'Importance of Genetic screening' was organized by The Dept of Foods and Nutrition, UGC-DSA SAPII, in collaboration with MERD India, and Kashiben Gordandas Patel Children's hospital, Vadodara on 9th, 10th September 2016. "World Economic and Sports Conference", was organized by Faculty of Commerce and Department of Physical Education jointly with Global Economists Forum and Sports Federation, in October 2016. International Conference on 'Khadi and Handlooms Through Design Intervention' was organized by Department of Clothing and Textiles, in association with Consortium of Green Fashion, Pune in September, 2016.

Sports Activities:

In the area of Sports also the university has proven its mettle. Girl's Basket Ball Team secured 1st Position in School & College League Tournament and won cash Award of Rs. 5 Lakhs. Students of Department of Physical Education participated in All India Wrestling Inter University Competition at Haryana in February 2017. The sports team of university had won the State College League Championship organized by the Government of Gujarat.

Students' Activities:

In our university, various tech-fete and other youth events are also organized and managed by the students themselves. To illustrate, a few here-Footprints, is being organized by the students of the Faculty of Technology &Engineering with participation of more than 30,000 students across the country to showcase and sharpen their technical skills through competitions and open houses with the involvement of industry and academia. Another popular event organized by the students of this faculty is "Paramarsh" a non-technical soft skills honing event which comprises of Guest Lectures, Entrepreneurial Workshops, Debates and Quiz Contests. BBA Baazigar is being organized by the students of BBA program of the Faculty of Commerce to introduce to the students to real markets through Business Games.

The Sayaji Literature Festival is being organized by the students of the Faculty of Arts with diverse activities like Plays, Workshops, Story Writing, Poetry Writing, Film Appreciation and Panel Discussions. Youth festival of the University, which is a very popular even among the students, brings together all departments of the University in a collective showcase of talent. There are many other events conducted in the University throughout the year, which garner immense attention of the students.

Faculty of Commerce organized, CASCADE which consists of Sports events, Interactive Guest Lectures and School level Business Initiatives. Faculty of Management studies organizes YUVANTAS, a short film making competition. LUX ET VERITAS a Moot Court Competition is conducted by Faculty of Law to inculcate skills of Advocacy, Analysis of laws. It also provides free legal aid to needy. Faculty of Science organizes CYBERIA, which is on the themes related to Software and Internet. TATHAGAT, acting workshops is conducted by Faculty of Performing Arts. A design and crafts festival VASANTOTSAV is being organized by Maharaja Ranjitsingh Institute of Design (MRID). Physio Fiesta 2016: Cultural Festival was organized by students of Department of Physiotherapy, Faculty of Medicine in April 2016.

Road Map:

At present, the University is in a transition stage from the old school of teaching to the new school of teaching which involves On-Line Courses, Virtual Labs, Flip Class Room Concept and Learning Using Smart-Phones. The university has already installed ICT infrastructure to implement these concepts across the campus. The first step in this direction has already been taken in the form of installation of SWAYAM Prabha DTH Channels in each of the faculty of the university. Many of the traditional class rooms are now IT-enabled with Smart Boards and Multimedia facilities. Next step will be offering of On-Line Courses as well as providing logistic support for development of the On-Line Content by the faculty members.

The university will be developing a dedicated studio to promote use of Information Technology in near future. Another step will be inclusion of Virtual Labs in the Curriculum. ICT-enabled Studios and class rooms will be used for conducting interactive sessions between the experts in various disciplines within India and abroad with students of the university. This will lead to direct exposure of students to the global pool of expertise.

On the research front, the university would like to strengthen the number of sponsored research projects worth at least Rs. 100 Crores every year from the year 2020. Towards this university will setup more centers of focused research across the campus. The university would like to implement is the commercialization of at least 10 technologies per year developed on campus. Technology Transfer Cell of the university will take the lead in this direction by liaisoning with industrial houses and potential clients.

Best Practices

"Residence Course" under which students stay in "FCRM House" which is a laboratory to apply theories and principles related to management of resources and group living. It aims at simulating a "homelike" situation for practical experience in day-to-day living. FCRM House experience provides opportunity to learn to manage Human and non-human resources at their disposal which sensitise the students for conservation of resources. Students are given an opportunity to learn Event Management, Banquet management. The students also learn to apply the element and principles of interior designing in the House. This is done under continuous advise, supervision and evaluation of a staff Advisor.

Research papers in the past five years are reviewed by the Masters students. The Ph.D scholars share work progress and all faculty and students who have attended seminar, workshops, internship, study tour etc, share their learning by means of presentation during the seminar.

"Experience is a great teacher", hence teachers with years of experience are assigned research scholars or new staff members as paired partners for teaching, evaluating, research and administrative activities.

Junior teachers discussed their lesson plans and evaluation techniques to their mentors and take relevant guidance for the research guidance. The junior teachers are co-guides which helps them later to take guidance work independently.

Each class has student advisors to address student's needs, similarly mentors who are experts in their areas with many years of experience of taking the courses act as mentors. Each course offered in a semester is mentored by expert staff.



Instead of having a conventional time table, use a module method where the same subject is taught in the class for two to four weeks. This has certainly enhanced responses from students and has largely facilitated learning. It helps them retain information as one meets regularly over the days of the entire module; it helps to connect with the earlier class much better. It also helps teachers as they can concentrate on fewer subjects at a time over the entire module allowing them to integrate more insight in their teaching.





Faster electronic conversion of typed text

tudents pursuing Bachelors in Computer Application from M S University's Faculty of Science have developed a mathematical approach that increases the speed of electronic conversion. This is the first time that they have worked on artificial intelligence tools. Using the mathematical approach of 2D template correlation, they have developed the software - optical character recognition (OCR) that will reduce the effort of typing.
The approach used by Aarsh Sheth, Jinal Jasani and Rakesh Solanki also consumes less energy in comparison to other approaches. OCR is the electronic conversion of images of typed, handwritten or printed text into machine-encoded text, whether from a scanned document.

Dr Arun Pratap of M SUniversity has developed Academic Performance (AP) Index, a mathematical formula that will identify the exact number of ci-

tation done during research.
AP-index overcomes the limitations of H-index introduced by Argentine American profes-sor of physics Jorge Eduardo Hirsch. Till date, H-index is the most popular citation indicator used by research scholars

"H-index does not take into consideration the number of ci tations beyond Hirsch core, which had a negative impact on the scoring of a researcher. Moreover, it also lacked in considering the number of citations within the limit of Hirsch core," sa-id Pratap, whose paper on AP in-dex, within and beyond Hirsch code has been published in the newsletter of International Society for Scientometrics and In-formetrics. "The proposed AP-index will take into account all the papers cited by a research scholar," he said.

MSU's polymer lab modernized






