


Fig. 3. The inscribed stone plaque, School Of Arts, Chennai, 1850.




Fig. 6. Models for drawing in scientific drawing classes, Madras School of Arts and Crafts.






Fig. 7. Various objects manufactured for public in the Industrial Section of Madras School of Arts and Crafts, 1890s.






Fig. 12. D.P. Roy Chowdhary, Night, 1950s water colour and wash on paper.
