

CHAPTER – III

METHODOLOGY

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3.1. INTRODUCTION

The researcher has included in this chapter a comprehensive description of the method, and information of variables, population, and sample. The design of the study, control of the threats to experimental validity, tools and statistical procedures employed for the analyses of the data is also discussed as under in subsequent sections.

3.2 POPULATION

All the P.T.C. (Primary Teacher Certificate) Colleges in Gujarat State that impart primary teacher-training programme. There were 341 registered P.T.C. Colleges in Gujarat State as per the website of National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Bhopal.

3.3 SAMPLE

The First Year P.T.C. students of the DIET (District Institute of Education and Training) P.T.C. College, Idar were selected as a sample for the present study. It was a purposive sampling as the college authorities were willing to permit the researcher to use and implement the developed modules for the purpose of the stated research. The letter about the research carried out is attached in the Appendix- II.

3.4 VARIABLES

The independent variable is developed modules that is meant to enhance primary student-teachers' English language ability whereas the dependent variable is student-teachers' academic achievement in Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing skills based on researcher developed Pre and Post test.

3.5 TOOLS AND TECHNIQUE

Academic achievement was measured with the help of Pretest – Posttest. Opinionnaire and Attitude scales were used to collect the required data. The details of the tools and technique employed to serve the purposes of the present study has been presented below.

3.6 PRETEST – POSTTEST ACHIEVEMENT TEST

For developing Pre and Post Test academic achievement, researcher referred the English (Second Language) Textbooks of Standards IV to VIII published by Gujarat State Board of School Textbooks, Gandhinagar. The researcher also studied the Standard 4 to 12 English (Second Language) Textbooks of the Gujarat Board and listed down the required competencies that student is supposed to achieve by the successful completion of twelve years of schooling and thereafter, the test was constructed. The pretest-posttest was constructed in line with the modules that the researcher implemented. The test was of total 40 marks, aimed to assess Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing skills acquired by the first year students of Primary Teacher – Training College before and after the implementation of the modules.

After developing initial draft of the test, it was given to the experts of the English language and the experts in the field of Education. Based on experts' suggestions, the test was modified and appended in the Appendix- III. The same pretest was employed as posttest in the present study.

3.7 OPINIONNAIRE

To study the opinion of Experimental Group primary student-teachers towards the developed modules for enhancing English language abilities, Objective 3 'To study the opinion of Experimental Group primary student-teachers towards the developed modules for enhancing English language abilities' of the present study, the researcher constructed the Opinionnaire on the three-point scale, 'Agree', 'Cannot Say' and 'Disagree'. The Opinionnaire encompassed various statements to collect the students' opinion towards the developed modules in terms of listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. The Opinionnaire was read, studied with reference to the modules to be implemented and then, it was modified accordingly. The first draft of the Opinionnaire contained 40 statements. Researcher, then, for the purpose of the face-validation, gave the Opinionnaire to the experts and modified it again based on experts' suggestions. The final draft of the Opinionnaire contained total 30 statements which were classified into four major categories by the researcher as mentioned under:

- I. Appreciation shown towards the modules
- II. Activity-oriented teaching in language learning
- III. Use of Technology/ICT in language learning

IV. Kinesthetic-learning aspects in modules

The final draft of the Opinionnaire Scale is given in Appendix- IV.

3.8 ATTITUDE SCALE

The objective 4 was, “to study the change in attitude of the primary student-teachers of Experimental Group towards English language”; therefore, the researcher constructed the attitude scale. The researcher enlisted the basic components on which the student-teachers’ attitude can be studied and a total of five components were listed down mentioned as under:

- I. The importance of the English language
- II. Liking towards the English language
- III. Views of primary student-teachers on English language teaching in present context
- IV. Negativities towards English language
- V. Lack of exposure for the learning of English

The attitude scale was constructed based on three point scale in which three options ‘Agree’, ‘Disagree’, and ‘Can’t Decide’ were given. Initial draft of the attitude scale, contained a total of 55 statements. It was given to the experts in the field of Education and the attitude scale was modified by incorporating their suggestions. The final draft of the attitude scale used in this study encompassed total 40 statements spread over five components as stated above and shown in Appendix- V.

3.9 RESEARCHER’S DIARY

A diary was maintained by the researcher to note down specific observations of the student-teachers’ progress in the English language learning with focus on the four skills namely listening, speaking, reading and writing. The common errors in pronunciation, modulation of voice, spelling, sentence formation, use of capital and small letter, punctuations and grammatical constructions were noted down and corrective measures offered. The activities and involvement of each student-teacher was also noted down.

3.10 DESIGN OF THE STUDY

The study followed quasi-experimental-pretest-posttest design in which two groups: Control and Experimental were taken.

O1 X O2 O1 O3 = Pretests, X = exposure of a group to the developed modules

O3 C O4 O2 O4 = Posttests, C = exposure of a group to the functional approach

3.11 CONTROL OF EXPERIMENTAL VALIDITY

The total number of students as per the roll call of the college was 36 of which 3 students dropped out of the college in between the year. Of the 33 students, the researcher selected 18 students comprising of Boarders as the Experimental Group and 15 Day Scholar students served as the Control Group. Further on, 1 student from each of the groups did not participate in the tests and were by and large irregular for the classes. The final number of students considered for study was 31. The Experimental Group comprised of 17 students while the Control Group had 14 students. Taking into account the extraneous effect of having the Experimental and Control Groups from the same college, the researcher decided to divide them by way of Boarders and Day Scholars. The Control Group was administered the English classes during the college hours while the Experimental Group was given the treatment after college hours.

3.12 PLAN AND PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The plan and procedure of the study is discussed as under in different phases:

3.12.1 PHASE 1 DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE MODULES AND TOOLS

The Content of English Textbooks: The researcher conducted a study to look into the content of the Gujarati Medium English textbooks (Second Language) of Gujarat State School Text Book Board, Gandhinagar (2012) from Standards Fourth to Eight. On studying the content of English language for elementary level, the researcher also found the quality of the primary student-teachers very low in the English language which was observed by him while taking classes in the English Subject, correction of lesson plans, reading practices, vocabulary and grammar testing, speech-recitals, phonetic exercises, etc. The interaction with them in the classroom situation also helped the researcher to learn the classroom dynamics and the psychology and learning behavior of the primary student-teachers towards the English language. The factors responsible for their low achievement as observed by the researcher during the 6 years (2007-2012) as Principal of St. Xavier's PTC College, Himmatnagar were the following: Lack of English environment, Rural background, First generation learners, No one to guide them, Poor facilities and infrastructure, Lack of confidence and fear of committing

mistakes, Very few opportunities at hand, Being a foreign language and so being hard to learn, Defeatist attitude and Easy going ways and lack of hard work.

To overcome these barriers and keeping in mind the various approaches to the teaching and learning of English language and having an eclectic view point since there is no one approach or method best suited for learning a language: “Most language teaching programs operate from a basis of informed eclecticism rather than by attempting to rigidly implement a specific method” Richards and Rodgers (1986); a kaleidoscopic and an assimilation of approaches by way of ‘informed eclecticism’ was fused into the development of the modules. A combination of structural, situational and communicational language situations was developed to cover the four language skills: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Reading materials, lexical contents and its contextual use, phonological and communicative applications, was employed in selecting and grading the subject matter for comprehension and learning.

The modules were developed with an overview of the textbooks of Standard IV to VIII English Textbooks (2012) published by the Gujarat State Board of School Textbooks, a wide variety of publications for English language teaching and learning with each module having certain competencies to be achieved by the teachers in terms of LSRW skills. Further, the modules were designed keeping in mind the various strategies and learning situations like dialogue, role-play, declamation, recitation, group discussion, critical appreciation, pictures, power-point-presentation, film, audio-visual cassettes, ‘Improve Your Pronunciation’ CD by Victor W. Tucker S.J. (2009), etc. The training modules were designed and were given to the experts (elementary school English teachers and educators) to obtain their suggestions for modification. As per their suggestions a series of modifications were made and incorporated into the modules, and thus, the content validity of the modules was established. English rhymes, action songs, interesting, lively and a joyful learning experience. There were totally 8 Modules which are given in Appendix- VI.

The various tools: Pretest-Posttest, Opinionnaire and Attitude scales were developed by the researcher and they were face-validated by obtaining the experts’ suggestions which has been discussed in previous sections.

3.12.2 PHASE 2 DATA COLLECTION

The steps followed during the duration of the experiment for the Experimental and the Control Groups are shown below in Table 3.1:

3.12.2.1 ADMINISTRATION OF PRETEST AND ATTITUDE SCALE

Before implementing the modules, the pretest was given to the first year students of PTC on 9th of February, 2013. The test for writing and listening skills were conducted in a group in the class itself which took 45 minutes. The tests for the speaking and the reading skills were done individually which consumed a little more than 2 hours 15 minutes. The attitude scale was also administered to the Experimental Group student-teachers to study the pre-existing attitude towards English language before experimentation. The Control Group student-teachers were given only pre-test.

3.12.2.2 IMPLEMENTATION OF DEVELOPED MODULES

After the pre-test was conducted for both the control and experimental groups on the 9th of February, 2013, the Gujarat State Board Textbooks of Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and Eight Standards which use the Functional Approach of teaching English for the control group were used by the English teacher. Periods were taken and care was taken that control group would also receive exposure for the same number of periods of teaching. The researcher implemented the

modules as mentioned in Table 3.4 in teaching the four skills: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing to the experimental group students. This treatment was given for 26 weeks by allotting an hour a day during college hours for the control group and after the college hours for the experimental group from Monday to Friday.

The following pattern was followed in the implementation of the modules as seen below in Table 3.2:

3.12.2.3 ADMINISTRATION OF POSTTEST

Both the group students were informed about the test to control mortality, a crucial factor in adversely affecting the experimental validity. The posttest was administered to the both the control and experimental group on the same day namely 5th of October, 2013. The test for writing and listening skills were conducted for the experimental and control group student-teachers together in the class itself. The tests for the speaking and the reading skills were done individually for both experimental and control group student-teachers.

3.12.2.4 ADMINISTRATION OF OPINIONNAIRE AND ATTITUDE SCALE

The Opinionnaire was administered to the experimental group student-teachers on 05th October, 2013 to gather their opinion towards the implemented modules which was meant to enhance their language abilities. They were instructed by the researcher to select just one option from ‘Agree’, ‘Disagree’ and ‘Can’t Decide’. They were further told to write the name and division in the Opinionnaire. To cast out their fears they were informed that it was not their test, and their opinions were not going to influence their performances. The attitude scale was also administered to the experimental group students on the 5th of October, 2013.

3.13 PHASE 3 DATA ANALYSIS

Mann – Whitney U test was used to study the effectiveness of the implemented modules and Wilcoxon-Signed Pair test was used to study the attitudinal change among experimental group students. The experimental group students’ opinion towards the developed modules was analyzed using percentage analysis and intensity index.
