C - COMMENTARY

There is a commentary Bhavapradipa' composed by Ramacandra Bhatta of Kashmir in 1876.

Incidentally it may be noted that there is one small work "Svalpa-Matsya-Purāna" of which two M&S in old Assamese characters are available in Assam. It was compiled during the first-half of the eleventh century and it consists of 49 chapters of which the first five give a summary of the first six chapters of the extant MP and the remaining deal entirely with the Dharmasāstr material e.g. dāna, śrāddha etc. The attention to this work was drawn by Manoranjan Shastri.
