### Content Description checklist for portrayals on Doordarshan

#### Instructions

1. Consider action taking place in one location as one scene. As and when a location changes, consider it as change of scene.
  2. Use frequency tally marks to indicate male and female presence.
  3. Consider male or female presence in a scene, and not the number of men and women. This checklist aims to collect "frequency of presence of male and female characters" and not "actual number of male and female characters"

- (2) Nature of programme (e.g. Serial, panel discussion etc.)
- (3) Month/Year of telecast of the programme.
- (4) Number of episodes viewed for content description.
- B. (1) Data of observation.
- (2) Observers name & address
