Shrikrishna Vasudeo Kalé was born in Poona, India, on April 10, 1924. He graduated from the Nutan Marathi Vidyalaya High School, Poona, in June, 1940, and entered the Sir Parashurambhau College which was then affiliated to the University of Bombay. In June 1941, he was given a Diploma in Commerce and Banking by the Government of Bombay. In June, 1942, the University of Bombay awarded him the Dr. F. G. Sebby Memorial Scholarship for his proficiency in Logic at the Intermediate Arts examination. In June, 1944, he received the degree of Bachelor of Arts from the University of Bombay, with first class Honors in Mental and Moral Philosophy. From June, 1944, to June, 1947, he was a member of the staff of the Sir Parashurambhau College serving in different capacities -College Fellow, Assistant Editor of the College magazine, and instructor. In June, 1947, he received the degree of Master of Arts in Philosophy from the University of Bombay. At the commencement ceremonies held this year, the Chancellor of the University presented to him Sir K. T. Telang Gold Medal and Prize as the best student of the University in Philosophy in that year and declared the award to him of Sir Lawrence Jenkins scholarship for studying law. In October 1948, he passed the first examination for the Bachelor of Law of the University of Bombay. From June, 1947, till August, 1949, he was Professor of Philosophy and Psychology, on the staff of Sir Parashurambhau College, Poona, India. In April, 1948, he was elected a life-member, to serve on the permanent management committee of the Shikshan Prasarak Mandali (Society for the Advancement of Education) which runs ten educational institutions of various kinds in

Western India.

In September, 1949, he came to the United States of America and entered the Psychology Department of the Columbia University, New York, for graduate studies in Experimental Psychology. In December, 1950, he received the A.M. degree in Psychology from Columbia University. In October, 1951, he was appointed as a graduate Navy Research Fellow, by the Instructional Film Research Program, at The Pennsylvania State College, State College, Pennsylvania. In December, 1951, he was elected an Associate of the American Psychological Association, in February, 1953, a member of the American Students' National Honorary Society in Psychology - the Psi Chi, and in March 1953, a member of the National Honorary Society for Science - the Sigma Xi. He is a life member of the All-India Psychological Association and the All-India Philosophical Association.
