Kumbha; was the mode of measuring the lands in the three districts of Jambusar, Amod, and Dahej in the Broach Collectorate during the nineteenth century. The "Kumbha"; was sub divided into "Malas". 100 Malas=1 Kumbha, which equals 3 roods, 33 perches, 422 decls., English land measure. 1 Mala= 20 feet 5 ¼ inches (English measure) 100 Malas = 1 Kumbha 100 Kumbhas = 95 acres, 3 roods, 22 perches, 2 decls. The 100th part of a Kumbha was 1 mallun = 9 guz of 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

1 mallun = 20 feet 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

The rod of 20 feet 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches with which the mallun was measured was called *Guntha*.

1Bigha= 20 Vasa.

1 Vasa =20 Biswa/ Veesvas

The *Bigha* like the English acre was an entirely square measure. The *Guntha* or rod, by which the measurements were made, was computed at 5 *haths*.

20 such gunthas or 100 haths were the length of one side of a Bigha. The standard length of the guntha was 96 inches or 8 feet.
