

GLOSSARY

<u>Anabolkam</u>	A ghost ritual, so dangerous that it must be performed in total silence.
Bolava	Usually a priest, but in some cases indicated also the dancer, the medicine-man and the singer.
Ching-jaliya	Assistant appointed to negotiate an alliance or to resolve a dispute; an important functionary in the Hill social system.
Chattin	A variety of shifting cultivation that was practiced by the Chils till about two decades ago.
Chundlo	Contributions made by a person or friends relatives on important social and ritual occasions largely to be regarded as a sacrifice or form of collaboration.
Chilo	A harvest festival in honor of Indrag the 17th.
Chila	There is the Chila which is given for a slave's freedom.
Chila	A particularly intricate kind of dance brewed from dry maize flowers.
Chilan	A witch - a person who claims to have powers because it is inherent in them, often considered to be under the agency of the evil spirits.
Chilanie	A sorcerer, "a person who will be able to injure persons, animals and crops or enemies by magic".
Choj	Child wealth.
Charganai	A person who goes to live with his wife as a consequence of his being instead of the normal practice, when the wife lives with the husband.
Chir-wat	An usual local situation of the type described above.

- Genluru** The spot where the cattle of the village habitually take their all-day rest; believed to be the shrine of Radol the guardian spirit of the cattle.
- Ute** A moving market that gathers regularly on specified days in the week, at some of the big or villages in Salaya district.
- Jon** A demon-child regarded as dangerous to its own people.
- Jathara** A festival held once in twelve or fifteen years in honour of Jathar, the My god, and Jathar ever a month. Usually Jathara are celebrated jointly by a village or each.
- Sogani** A female spirit, possessing great occult powers and malignant to all living beings; usually employs witches and sorcerers in her evil deeds.
- Kachon** Member of a subordinate lineage group in a hill village. Poor, has a few economic privileges, but usually a limon or an affine of the limon of the village.
- Kadallo** A witch-doctor regarded as the most powerful of all the balaya, and also as leading a precarious life against the balaya.
- Kuvani** Right of a headman to a share in the bride-wealth received for a balaya girl.
- Kuvani** Obligations of liquor offered to a god especially at the Shabadi.
- Kog** Special claims that conventionally accrue to a particular function - such as a balaya balaya.
- Unlohi** A ritual chant of propitiation for the soul a sick person.
- Kola** A festival in honour of a deity - a ritual in which men and women of large age freely participate singing and dancing.
