

## Appendix - L

Your answers may be recorded on this test or on a special answer sheet attached here.

## PART - I

Directions : This test is made up of pairs of words which have either the same or opposite meaning. If two words mean the same or nearly the same, mark the space under S on the answer sheet, if two words mean the opposite or nearly the opposite, mark the space under Ø on the answer sheet. If you are using the test for answering write 'O' or S as appropriate.

For example : In item A below, "hot" and "cold" mean the opposite so in line A under EXAMPLES, Part I on the answer sheet, the space under Ø should be blackened.

In item B below, "big" and "large" mean the same, so in line B of the answer sheet the space under S should be blackened.

Be sure that the space you mark on the answer sheet is numbered the same as the question you are answering. Omit those items that you could answer only by pure guess, but answer all you think you know, even if you are not quite certain. Do not study long over any pair.
