INTRODUCTION

The Vice-Chancellor has great pleasure in presenting to the Senate, on behalf of the Syndicate, this Thirty-first Annual Report for the year 1979-80. The activities of the various Faculties and different Institutions of the University and the progress achieved in the year 1979-80, are presented in the following pages.

The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda has a long history which goes as far back as 1881, the year the Baroda College was founded by Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad III. The Kalabhavan was established in 1890. These two institutions formed the nucleus of the University which came into being in 1949. The University was actually conceived in 1919 during the Maharaja's reign when a committee was appointed to explore the possibilities of establishing a university in Baroda. An elaborate report was drawn up with a concrete proposal for the establishment of a university; but it was felt that the time was not yet ripe for a university.

The idea was revived in 1925 when the Baroda University Commission was appointed. It submitted its report in 1927. Its principal recommendations were that a university should be established immediately in Baroda; that it should be called "Sir Sayajrao University of Baroda"; that it should be unitary and residential, having the Faculties of Arts, Science, Technology and Agriculture, Economics, Commerce and Administration.

So the following institutions of higher learning were established in Baroda:

- (1) The Secondary Teachers' Training College in 1935,
- (2) The Sayaji Golden Jubilee Science Institute in 1937,
- (3) The Pratapsinh College of Commerce and Economics in 1942, and
- (4) Government orders were passed for the establishment of Medical and Engineering Colleges, which ultimately began functioning from 1949.

Soon after Independence the Maharaja Sayajirao University, the Unitary Teaching type, came into existence on 30th April, 1949 with the following institutions:

- (a) Constituent Institutions under the management of the University:
 - (1) The Baroda Arts and Science College
 - (2) The Pratapsinh College of Commerce and Economics

- (3) The Secondary Teachers' Training College
 (4) The Kalabhavan and the Engineering College
 (5) The Music College
 (6) The Oriental Institute
- (b) Constituent College under the management of the Government of Bombay :
- (7) The Baroda Medical College
- (c) Constituent recognised Institutions under the management of the Government of Bombay :
- (8) The Baroda Museum and Picture Gallery
 (9) The Baroda Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya

By June, 1950 these institutions were reorganized into the six Faculties of Arts, Science, Education and Psychology, Medicine, Commerce and Technology and Engineering, and three new Faculties of Fine Arts, Home Science and Social Work were also established. In 1951, the Baroda Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya and Gujarati Section of the Old Baroda High School were taken over from the Government of Bombay. To-day the University has the following Faculties and Institutions under it :—Faculties of Arts, Science, Education and Psychology, Commerce, Medicine, Technology and Engineering, Fine Arts with the College of Indian Music, Dance and Dramatics, Home Science, Social Work, Law, Oriental Institute, Polytechnic, Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, Centre for Continuing/Adult Education and Community Services, and M. K. Amin Arts and Science College and College of Commerce, Padra.

Growth of Student Enrolment

The University started with 2,962 students on its roll. In 1979-80 it had 18,962 University students and 2,386 non-University students. The following table gives student enrolment figures for the year 1974-75 to 1979-80 :

University Teachers :

Teacher -Student Ratio :—The total number of teachers (including Teaching Assistants, Senior/Junior Instructors, Tutors, Honorary and Part-time Teachers) in the Faculties and Institutions of the University during the year under report was 1,073 (including 167 teachers of the Medical College) as against the total student enrolment of 18,962. This gives an over-all teacher-student ratio of 1 : 17.6. The corresponding strength of University teachers and teacher-student ratio over the last five years is indicated below :

Hostel and Health Services :

Halls of Residence :—The demand from students for accommodation in the University Halls of Residence has been increasing. All possible steps are being taken to increase the hostel facilities for students. At its start in 1949, the University had accommodation for only 400 men students and no accommodation for women students. At the end of the year under review there were 12 Halls for men and 4 for women students. There were 2,588 men students and 667 women students in the different Halls. The percentage of students residing in the University Hostels works out to 17.1. The corresponding figures for the five years are as under :

Rules for Medical Reimbursement on the lines of those existing in the Government were implemented for the non-teaching staff and their family members, covered under the Second Pay Commission's Scales of pay. During 1979-80, an amount of Rs. 33,278-22 was reimbursed by the Government.

The Senate met twice during the year on 18th November, 1979 and 23rd March, 1980. Fifty members attended the meeting on 18th November, 1979 and fifty-six on 23rd March, 1980.

Meeting of November 1979 :

Election of one member from amongst the members of the Faculty of Medicine was held. Three fellows were assigned to the Faculties. Replies to Questions and Supplementary Questions were given. Supplementary grant amounting to Rs. 45,400/- was sanctioned. Ordinances mentioned in Pamphlet No. 23 of Handbook Part II—1967 were considered and noted. The proposal for addition of new Statute 137-A was passed. The proposal to amend Statute 199 was passed. The proposal to amend Statute 209-A was referred back to the Syndicate for reconsideration. The Thirtieth Annual Administrative Report and Thirtieth Annual Accounts for the year 1978-79 were considered and the excess of expenditure over the revised estimates for the year 1978-79 was sanctioned.

The Report of the Board of Accounts for the year 1978-79 submitted to the Senate was noted. The proposal for institution of posts in the Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Commerce and Polytechnic was considered and passed. The proposal for institution of Medals, Prizes and Visiting Fellowships was passed.

Meeting of March 1980 :

One fellow was assigned to the Faculty. Replies to Questions and Supplementary Questions were given. The Annual Financial Statement comprising the revised estimates for the year 1979-80 and the estimates for the year 1980-81 as set out in details were approved. Ordinances mentioned in Pamphlet No. 24 of Handbook Part II—1967 were considered and noted. The proposals for amendment of Statute 200 and Statute 209-A were considered and passed. The proposals for the institution of posts in the Faculty of Science, Faculty of Education and Psychology, and Faculty of Commerce, and redesignation of the post in the M. K. Amin Arts and Science College and College of Commerce, Padra, were considered and passed. The proposal for the institution of Medals, Scholarships and Prizes was passed.

CHAPTER III—OTHER AUTHORITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. Council for Post-graduate Studies and Research :

The Council for Post-graduate Studies and Research met on 5th July, 1979 and 12th December, 1979. The following were the main items considered and recommended by the Council and approved subsequently by the Syndicate.

- (i) A Committee appointed with powers of the Council to consider and recommend directly to the Syndicate (a) Proposals for continuation of the various research schemes previously approved and (b) New Research Schemes for implementation.

- (iii) Recognition of 19 teachers as Post-graduate teachers for guiding students for Ph.D. degree in different subjects for various post-graduate courses including those in the Faculty of Medicine.
- (iv) Recommendation of a grant of Rs. 6,000/- for the year 1980-81 towards the Research work done by the Textile and Allied Industries Research Organisation, Baroda.
- (v) Recommendation of extension of time to 10 students and permission given to them to submit their theses late under provision of Ph.D. 4 (iii).
- (vi) Permission given to three teachers from the Faculty of Technology and Engineering to do Ph.D. independently and act as their own guide under O. Ph.D. 3 (ii).
- (vii) Permission given to Seventeen students from different Faculties for Ph.D. registration in related subjects under O. Ph.D. 1 (vii).
- (viii) Recommendation that Dr. J. N. S. Yadava (Scientist C) of the Department of Microbiology, Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow, a recognised Research Centre of this University be recognised as University Post-graduate Teacher of this University for guiding Ph.D. students in the subject of Microbiology (Bacteriology and Virology) for the benefit of eligible students of this University or persons deputed by this University.
- (ix) Recommendation that Dr. V. P. Vaishnav, Director, Vaccine Institute recognised as a Post-graduate teacher for guiding Ph.D. students

in the subject of Microbiology (Medical) as recommended by the Dean, Medical College, Baroda in view of the fact that the Vaccine Institute is a recognised Research Centre as per S.R. No. 4(3)(i) dated 2-2-1974.

- (x) Recommendation that the proposal No. FS/4737 dated 30-3-1979, received from Professor S. S. Merh, Head of the Geology Department and the Dean, Faculty of Science, requesting to continue his Research Scheme entitled "Structural Studies in Kathmandu Neppe" and sanctioning an amount of Rs. 2,000/- from contingencies and field work including travelling and daily allowance for the current year i.e. from 1st April, 1979 to 31st March, 1980, which was approved last year as per S.R. No. 29(4)(B)(6) dated 28th January, 1978 but could not be utilised on account of certain special circumstances *be approved*.

Master, a Post-graduate student be permitted to continue his Ph.D. studies in the subject of Anatomy as a special case as required by him, by doing his research work at the Medical College, Jamnagar, and paying frequent visits to Baroda to seek the guidance of his guide Dr. H. C. Srivastav at Baroda Medical College.
- (xvi) Recommendation that Dr. C. S. P. Iyer, Scientific Officer, Analytical Chemical Department, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Bombay-400085 be recognised as a Ph.D. guide in the subject of Chemistry as the Bhabha Atomic Energy Establishment, Trombay (Government of India), Bombay has been recognised as an Institution for Research for the Ph.D. degree in various groups of scientific subjects for eligible students of this University and persons deputed by the University as per S.R. No. 58 (6) dated 23-6-1964.
- (xvii) Recommendation that M.Sc. degree holders in any branch of Chemistry be admitted to Ph.D. degree course in Applied Chemistry and that every case should be referred for consideration to the Council of Post-graduate Studies and Research.
- (xviii) Recommendation that Shri Shah Narendrabhai Chimanlal whose request for exemption from paying tuition fees, as per Government rules as stated in the true copy of the letter No. 4494/33/50431/Q dated 26th October, 1951 from V. S. Mahajani, Dy. Secretary to the Govt. of Bombay, L.S.G.R.H. Department, Bombay Castle, sent by the Dean, Medical College, Baroda as per his letter No. PG/12381 dated 19-11-1979, and as he is a Government Officer, working as Assistant Professor at Medical College, Baroda, be not granted exemption from paying tuition fees and he be asked to pay the necessary fees as per University rules.

- (1) Faculty of Arts :—
- *(i) Recommended that the existing paper prescribed for S.Y.B.A. (Major) and T.Y.B.A. (Major) for all subjects under the Faculty be renumbered serially as proposed.
- *(ii) Recommended the draft of the certificate styled as " Veda Patra Pravin " to be awarded by the Baroda Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya to students passing the said examination successfully.
- *(iii) Recommended that the existing courses in Arabic Language for F.Y.B.A. (Optional) and S.Y.B.A. (Minor) be continued for the year 1980-81 and the same be made effective progressively from the academic year 1980-81.
- *(iv) Recommended that the students who hold B.A. or B.Sc. degree of a recognised University, and have been admitted to degree course of the Faculty of Fine Arts be given exemption in the language subjects of " English " and " Hindi ", provided that they have studied and passed these subjects in First Year B.A. or First Year B.Sc., or S.Y.B.A. or S.Y.B. Sc., or B.A. or B.Sc. degree examination/s of this University or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto by this University.

- *(xviii) Recommended that the spirit of the recommendations as contained in the report on U.G.C. Workshops on Modernisation of Philosophy Courses is already reflected in the present courses in Philosophy and that will be kept in view while revising the courses in Philosophy from time to time in future too.

- *(iii) Recommended that the existing syllabi for F.Y.B.Sc. Principal and Subsidiary in the subject of Chemistry be revised and approved as proposed.

- *(iv) Recommended certain appropriate qualifications in the various allied disciplines in order to carry out interdisciplinary teaching and research in the Department of Geology.

- *(iii) Recommended that the existing syllabi prescribed for F.Y.B.Com., in the subject of Statistics be revised and approved as recommended by the Committee appointed by the Faculty.

(4) *Faculty of Law* :—

- *(i) Recommended that the matter regarding conversion of existing morning and evening Law Colleges and Departments into whole time day Colleges and Departments be accepted in principle.
- *(ii) Recommended that the provision in the matter of computing of Semester Results of LL.B. (Special) and LL.B. (General) as proposed

be approved with the additoin that proposed draft amendments of the relevant Ordinances be also approved.

*(iii) Recommended that the existing Semester System for LL.B. (General) and LL.B. (Special) degree courses be abolished progressively with effect from the academic year 1980-81 in order to restore the system of yearly examinations for the above courses, subject to the condition that the full-time LL.B. Degree Course when introduced by the Faculty of Law should be based on the semester system.

*(iv) Recommended that the provision contained in part 2 of O. S. L. 18 be deemed to have been discontinued with effect from 1980-81 with the modification that the changes made in nomenclature of various subjects when the semester system was introduced be incorporated in the Ordinances.

- *(iii) Recommended that the Ordinances relating to the Bachelor of Education course be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(iv) Recommended that the existing syllabi, course contents, scheme of examination etc. regarding the existing Professional Diploma Course in Educational Administration be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(v) Recommended that the writing of the Dissertation at the M.Ed. course be made compulsory and O. M.Ed. 4 be amended as proposed.

be approved and the outlines of the subject of Psycho-pharmacology be included in the existing syllabus of M.D. Psychiatry course as proposed.

*(ii) Recommended that the existing ordinance governing provision of admission requirements of various subjects of M.Sc. (Medical) degree course of the Faculty of Medicine be amended as proposed.

*(iii) Recommended that the proposal of introduction of the subject of Pharmacology at the B.Physio. degree course be modified and approved as proposed.

(7) *Faculty of Technology and Engineering* :—

*(i) Recommended that the existing scheme of examination in the subject of Fluid Mechanics at Second Semester of B.E. III (CME) be modified and approved as proposed.

*(ii) Recommended that the existing Syllabus of Instrumentation at M.E. (Civil) in Environmental Engineering Part I be revised.

*(iii) Recommended that the Syllabi for the subjects of (a) Construction Technology at II Semester of S.Y. Diploma (Civil), (b) Transportation Engineering at II Semester of Third Year Diploma (Civil) be revised and approved as proposed by the Committee.

*(iv) Recommended that the existing scheme of teaching and examination of M.E. (Civil) in Water Resources Engineering be modified and approved as proposed.

*(v) Recommended that the existing scheme of teaching and Examination of M.E. (Civil) in Geotechnical Engineering be modified and approved as proposed.

*(vi) Recommended that the existing Elective subject of Advanced Soil Mechanics be replaced by a new Elective subject of Offshore Foundation at B.E. (Civil) IInd Semester Elective Group D as proposed.

*(ix) Recommended that the Syllabi in the subject of Mechanical Engineering at Second Semester of Second Year Diploma in Textile Chemistry be approved as proposed.

*(x) Recommended that the existing Scheme of working and examination in the B.E. IV Metallurgical Engineering in I and II Semesters be revised and approved as proposed.

*(xi) Recommended that the revised syllabus of the paper entitled Industrial Administration and Factory Law for the B.Text. (Tech.) II Semester as recommended by the Committee appointed by the Board of Studies in Commerce including Business Administration be approved.

*(xii) Recommended that the existing Scheme of Examination and teaching and the syllabi for B.Sc. D.T.C. one year course for students joining Final Year D.T.C. after passing B.Sc. examination be revised and approved as proposed.

*(xv) Recommended that the proposed new 2-year Master's Degree Course in Housing to be introduced under the Department of Architecture of the Faculty be approved academically.

*(xvi) Recommended that the proposed Common Draft Ordinances for all M.E. (Courses) including M.E. degree course in Petro-chemicals be approved as proposed.

- *(xvii) Recommended that a course on Computational Techniques be introduced at the First Semester of B.E. IV (Met.) and the course content, teaching and examinations scheme be the same as that prescribed for B.E. IV (Electrical).
- *(xviii) Recommended that the course on Met. Instrumentation of the I Semester of B.E. IV (Met.) be transferred to II Semester of B.E. IV (Met.).
- *(xix) Recommended that the existing schemes for teaching and examinations for the B.E. (Electrical) and B.E. (Electronics) courses and details of syllabi prescribed therefor should be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xx) Recommended that the proposed syllabi for Industrial Electronics, I, II, III and IV be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xxi) Recommended that the existing subject of Electrotechnics I of II Semester of B.E. II (C.M.E.Ch., Met.) be shifted to the I Semester of B.E. III (M.E and Ch.).
- *(xxii) Recommended that the existing subject of Elect. Engg. I (Now modified as Electrical Machines I) be shifted from I Semester of B.E. III (Electrical) to the II Semester of B.E. III (Electrical).
- *(xxiii) Recommended that the existing subject of Electrotechnics II be shifted from I Semester B.E. III (Chem.) to the II Semester of B.E. III (Chem.).
- *(xxiv) Recommended that the existing syllabus of the subject of Electrical Engineering and Electronics of the I Semester of B.E. III (Civil and Met.) be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xxv) Recommended that the teaching and examination scheme of B.Pharm. III and B.Pharm. IV (New Scheme) be approved as proposed.

- *(xxix) Recommended that the proposal of the Dean of the Faculty of Technology and Engineering in the matter of admission of various Diploma holders of the M. S. University of Baroda to the full time degree courses of four years duration in the corresponding branch through the entrance test from June 1980 and other details therefor be approved.
- *(xxx) Recommended that the provision of the minimum age requirement for admission to various Degree and Diploma courses of the Faculty and Polytechnic be deemed to have been deleted from the academic year 1980-81 and onwards.
- *(xxxi) Recommended that the proposed scheme of giving credit by way of incentive to be given to students undertaking N.C.C. training during First two years of their studies be approved for being implemented in the Faculty (including Polytechnic) provided that they have attended the Annual Camps organized by the N.C.C. authorities.
- *(xxxii) Recommended that 50% internal weightage be continued for all degree classes except for Pre-final and Final Year where 30% weightage is given.

- *(xxxv) Recommended that the existing syllabi, schemes of teaching and examinations, A.T.K.T. provision etc. prescribed for the First Year

Diploma courses in Civil, Mechanical, Electrical Engineering be made applicable to the First Year Diploma course in Production Engineering as well as First Year Diploma course in Industrial Electronics.

*(xxxvi) Recommended that the proposed revised scheme of teaching and examinations for the First Year Diploma courses in Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Production Engineering and Industrial Electronics be approved subject to the condition that the First and Second Semester examinations of the First Year Diploma courses in Production Engineering and Industrial Electronics be conducted by the Polytechnic as at present and not by the University.

*(xxxvii) Recommended that the existing syllabi schemes of teaching and examination for second and final year of diploma courses in Production Engineering and Industrial Electronics shall remain unchanged for all subjects except for the subjects of Mathematics III of Production Engineering and Mathematics III of Industrial Electronics as proposed by the Faculty.

*(xxxviii) Recommended that the proposed ordinances, A.T.K.T. provision, conduct of examinations etc. for the various Diploma courses run at the Polytechnic be revised and approved as recommended by the Dean, Faculty of Technology and Engineering and the Principal, Polytechnic in the light of the discussions that took place in the Faculty meeting.

(8) *Faculty of Fine Arts* :—

*(i) Recommended that the report of the Committee consisting of the Heads of the Departments concerned of the Faculty of Fine Arts in the matter of having Graphic Design as an optional subject in Painting and Sculpture at various level be approved as proposed.

*(ii) Recommended certain modifications regarding Applied Arts courses as proposed by the Head, Department of Applied Arts.

(iii) Recommended that the provision of making internship compulsory for the benefit of M.A. (Fine) Museology students in some good Museums in India for a suitable period be approved in principle.

*(iv) Recommended amendment of O.F. Museo. 1 governing the provision of admission requirements for M.A. (Fine) Museology degree course as proposed by the Faculty.

*(v) Recommended that the existing facilities for teaching the prescribed syllabi, scheme of examination as approved by the competent authorities be continued.

Note :—The recommendations marked with * are approved by the Syndicate.

(9) *Faculty of Home Science* :—

*(i) Recommended that the minimum number of intake of students for being admitted to the M.Sc. (Home) Programme of the Department of Child Development be the average of last three years' intake and the same be implemented provided all the teaching posts of the Department are filled by the University and the same be reviewed from time to time.

*(ii) Recommended that the Entrance test be held by the Department for purposes of regulating admissions to the M.Sc. (Home) Child Development Programme of the Faculty and details of the test be printed in the prescribed admission form and prospectus of the Faculty.

*(iii) Recommended amendment of the provision governing the admission requirements for the M.Sc. (Home) Child Development.

*(iv) Recommended that the existing outline of C.D. 332 course entitled Marriage and Family relationship of B.Sc. (Home) Programme be revised and approved as proposed.

*(v) Recommended that details of syllabi, admission requirements, duration of the course, mode of evaluation, award of classes for the Undergraduate Diploma in Child Development be approved.

*(vi) Recommended that the draft of the revised O.H.S. 1, O.H.S. 2 and O.H.S. 4 be approved as proposed.

*(vii) Recommended that the existing nomenclature of M.Sc. (Home) Institutional Management and Dietetics (D.I. Mgt.) course be changed to M.Sc. (Home) —Dietetics (Diet.).

*(viii) Recommended that the existing O.H.S. 13 I governing provision of admission requirements for M.Sc. (Home) Foods and Nutrition and M.Sc. (Home) Dietetics be amended as proposed.

*(ix) Recommended that the provision of the requirement of under-going six months compulsory Internship for the award of M.Sc. (Home) Dietetics degree be introduced and the list of suitable institutions at

which the students will be required to do their internship be approved as proposed.

- *(x) Recommended that the existing details of syllabi for certain courses of the B.Sc. (Home) Clothing and Textiles Programme be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xi) Recommended that the outlines of the courses entitled Ed. Ex. Communication in Non-formal Education of B.Sc. (Home)—Home Science Education and Extension Specialization Programme be approved as proposed.
- *(xii) Recommended that the credits assigned to Ed. Ex. 654 course entitled Curriculum Development and Appraisal of M.Sc. (Home) Education and Extension Programme be increased to three (3) credits and the existing outlines of the said course be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xiii) Recommended that the credits of Ed.Ex. 658 (a) Seminar of M.Sc. (Home) Education and Extension Programme be reduced to Two (2) Credits.
- *(xiv) Recommended that the non-credit compulsory course in Computer Science for Ph.D. candidates registered in the subject of Home Science Education and Extension Education be approved.
- *(xv) Recommended that the Guide of M.Sc. (Home) students who are not on panel of examiners be invited by the Chairman of the Board to sit at the time of viva-voce examination of their own students only as observers and the said provision be made applicable to all departments under the Faculty of Home Science.
- *(xvi) Recommended that the existing outline of H.M. 275—Time and Energy Management Course of B.Sc. (Home) Management Programme be revised and approved as proposed.
- *(xvii) Recommended that the recommendation made by the Committee appointed by Faculty reg. (a) the core programme compulsory for graduation with a B.Sc. (Home) degree, (b) amendment of O.H.S. 10, O.H.S. 16, O.H.S. 19, O.H.S. 20, O.H.S. 22 and O.H.S. 23 be approved.

Note :—The recommendations marked with * are approved by the Syndicate.

(10) Faculty of Social Work :—

- (i) Recommended that status quo be maintained in the matter of medium of instruction till the medium of instruction is changed at the Under-graduate level in the University.
- (ii) Recommended that since the Faculty of Social Work in this University is an institution for post-graduate teaching and its students come from all parts of India. English be retained as medium of instruction in this University.
- (iii) Recommended that at least one University in the state should have English as medium of instruction. Since this University has English as its medium of instruction, right from its inception, English be continued as the medium of instruction in this University to retain its all-India character. Informal exchanges with the educationists of all branches from various Universities, in Gujarat and outside Gujarat.
- (iv) Recommended that as an advanced preparation to change-over to regional language as medium of instruction (if at all finally accepted), the preparation of book requires adequate facilities. To the best of our knowledge such facilities are not available at this University today.
- (v) Recommended that since the teaching material in the form of books, journals etc. even of Indian Origin is mainly available in English, and that too readily, the Faculty in its present form is not in a position to undertake additional work of producing teaching material in the regional language.

Important recommendations made by Boards have been included in the recommendations of the Faculties mentioned in the preceding paragraphs.

CHAPTER IV—BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

1. University Board of Sports

Two meetings of the Board of Sports were held during the year. The Board recommended that (i) the University team should participate in various Inter-University Tournaments after selection of the teams by the Selection Committee, (ii) the payment of Rs. 20/- per player, Manager, Coach and Attendant be paid for the whole tournament as incidental charges for getting conveyance, portorage etc., (iii) admission to various Faculties on the basis of merit in sports be restored from June, 1980.

2. Publications Board

One meeting of the Board was held during the year. It recommended and/or sanctioned grants for publication of the works viz. (i) two Journals of the Department of Zoology *Animal Morphology and Physiology* and *PAVO*, Ornithology for the year 1979-80, (ii) the work *Naraharini Gnyangita* in Prachin Gurjar Granthmala and *Vivechak* under Professor B. K. Thakore Publication Series, (iii) The work *Commerce of Cambay from the Earliest Period to the 19th Century*. It also recommended the publication of the following two works in the Gaekwad Oriental Series (a) *Gurjara-Rasavali*, (b) *Descriptive Bibliography* of the printed Text of *Pancharatragama*.

3. Library Committee

The Committee met on 22nd November, 1979 and carried out the routine business and considered the result of stock taking of the books and writing of missing books.

4. Standing Committee on Equivalence of Examinations

The Committee met on 5th July, 1979. It considered a number of items regarding equivalence of examinations. The decisions taken at its meeting are as under :—

- (i) The (a) B.Com. Part I, (b) B.Sc. Part I and Pre-medical examinations conducted by the Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak be recognised as equivalent to the (a) F.Y.B.Com. and (b) F.Y.B.Sc. examination of this University respectively on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University.

(ii) The Certificate courses in French and German examinations conducted by the Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak, be recognised as equivalent to the Certificate courses in French and German examinations of this University on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University.

(iii) The M.A. (Arts and Archaeology) Examination conducted by the Indira Kala Sangit Vishwa Vidyalaya, Khairagarh (M.P.) be recognised as equivalent to M.A. (in Indian History Culture and Archaeology Group A and B) of this University on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University.

(iv) The Final Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Lucknow, U.P. be recognised as equivalent to the Final Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering of this University on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University as per existing rules.

(v) The Certificate courses as well as Diploma courses in German and Russian Examination conducted by the Kurukshetra University, Kurushetra (Haryana) be recognised as equivalent to the corresponding Certificate courses as well as Diploma courses in German and Russian examinations of this University respectively on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University.

(vi) The Final Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering conducted by the various Technical Examination Boards of the different State Governments (other than Gujarat and Maharashtra State) in India be generally recognised as equivalent to the corresponding Final Year Diploma in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering examinations of this University for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University as per existing rules.

(vii) The (a) First Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering (i.e. First and Second Semester examinations taken together) and (b) Second Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering (i.e. Third and Fourth Semester examinations taken together) examinations conducted by the respective Technical Examination Board in Gujarat

State as well as Maharashtra State be recognised as equivalent to the corresponding First Year and Second Year Diploma in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering examinations of this University respectively for the purposes of seeking admission to the Second Year and Third Year Diploma Classes in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering of Polytechnic of this University respectively, if they are otherwise eligible as per existing rules.

(viii) The Final Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering conducted by the State Board of Technical Education and Training, Tamilnadu be recognised as equivalent to the corresponding Final Year Diploma examinations in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering of this University on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies as per existing rules.

(ix) The Final Year Diploma courses in Mechanical Engineering (Sandwich Pattern) examination conducted by the State Board of Technical Education and Training, Tamilnadu be recognised as equivalent to the Final Year Diploma in Mechanical Engineering Examination of this University on reciprocal basis for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University as per existing rules.

(x) The National Form VI examination conducted by the National Examination Council, Tanzania be recognised as equivalent to the Higher Secondary Examination (XII Std.) of the Gujarat State, provided it is passed with at least five subjects including English and other required subjects with the required percentage of marks for purposes of admission to available higher courses of studies in this University, if they are otherwise eligible as per existing rules.

5. Committee of Deans and Heads of Institutions

The Committee met on 4th September, 1979 to consider the Government Resolution regarding qualifications for appointment to the post of Professors and Readers in the Faculty of Arts, Social Sciences including Commerce and Science.

6. Finance and Establishment Standing Committee

Eleven meetings of the Committee were held during the year. The Committee considered several items concerning requests for additional grants, purchase of equipment, approval of plans, estimates and tenders for construction

work, contract for various items and requests from the staff members regarding Study Leave etc. The recommendations of the Committee were placed before the Syndicate.

The Committee met as Budget Committee on 10th January, 1980. On scrutinizing various proposals received from Faculties, Institution and Offices of the University, it submitted to the Syndicate the revised estimates for the year 1979-80 and estimates for the year 1980-81.

7. Investment Committee

The Committee held nine meetings during the year. The recommendations of the Committee in respect of investment of the University funds were approved by the Syndicate.

8. Press Supervisory Committee

Eight meetings including a special meeting of the Committee were held during the year. They considered monthly reports of the Press Manager regarding the working of the Press, Stationery Unit, Publications and Sales Unit and also printing programme and made recommendations regarding purchase of paper, stationery, equipment etc.

9. Wardens' Committee

Two meetings of the Committee were held during the year and recommended faculty-wise and hall-wise allocation of seats for students in the first and second terms of the academic year. It considered revising the rules of the Halls of Residence in respect of the resident students serving elsewhere and local students, and reports of the various Inter-Hostel Committees.

10. National Service Scheme

One meeting of the Advisory Committee for National Service Scheme was held during the year. It approved the report of (i) the Special Camping Programme and (ii) General Activities of N.S.S. It recommended (i) the creation of N.S.S. Solace Fund for needy people in times of emergencies, to be called the Relief Fund of the Volunteers of National Service Scheme, (ii) the organisation of Inter-University Programme and introduction of certificate courses in training both for academic as well as practical exposure as a part of curriculum for camp organisation etc. for Special Programme.

11. Selection Committee

During the period, 1-4-1979 to 31-3-1980, there were 51 meetings of the Selection Committee appointed under Section 48 (2) of the Act, and they recommended 55 Candidates for appointment to the posts of Professors and/or Readers

in various Faculties and Institutions of the University. There were 29 meetings of the Standing Selection Committee for Junior Posts, and 21 meetings of the Standing Selection Committee for Class III posts and they recommended 39 and 22 Candidates respectively for appointment to various posts in the University.

12. M. S. University Students' Aid Fund Committee

The Committee met on 26th November, 1979. The total amount of help given to students by way of tuition fees, examination fees, drawing materials etc., during the year 1979-80 was Rs. 39,106/-.

13. Board of Extra Mural Studies

The Board met on 7th September, 1979 and recommended a programme of extension lectures by the University teachers and outside experts. An amount of Rs. 9,650/- was sanctioned for this purpose.

14. Advisory Committee for the University Health Centre

The Committee met on 9th July, 1979, and 13th December, 1979 for considering the appointment of Honorary Part-time Medical Officer and Honorary Gynaecologist etc. and for recommending the purchase of medicines, and other related matters.

15. Students' Welfare Board

One meeting of the Students' Welfare Board was held on 29th December, 1979. It recommended that the M. S. University Union be requested to suggest ways and means of raising Students' Welfare Fund by organising various programmes.

16. Board of Accounts

The Board met on 19-9-1979 and submitted its report on the accounts of the University for the year 1978-79 as required under Statute 105 to the Senate at its meeting held on 18th November, 1979. The Board again met on 8-3-1980 for consideration of the programme of Test Audit of University Accounts for the year 1979-80.

CHAPTER V—RESEARCH IN THE UNIVERSITY

During the year under report 124 new students (29 in Faculty of Arts; 38 in Faculty of Science; 5 in Faculty of Commerce; 29 in Faculty of Education and Psychology; 8 in Faculty of Home Science; 2 in Faculty of Medicine; 5 in Faculty of Technology and Engineering; 1 in Faculty of Law; 6 in Faculty of Fine Arts (including Music College); 1 in Faculty of Social Work) were registered for the Ph.D. Degree.

CHAPTER XI (B)—SHETH UJAMSHI PITAMBARDAS AYURVEDIC RESEARCH UNIT

1. Function of the Unit :

Research in Ayurveda is the primary concern of the Unit which has a library, a Museum of Indian Medicinal herbs and minerals, a Rasa-Shala and an Out-patient Department. Beds for Ayurvedic Clinical Research are made available by the Honorary Modern Physician attached to the Unit.

2. Staff :

The staff of the Unit consisted of an Honorary Head, an Honorary Modern Physician, a Research Officer, an Assistant Research Officer, a Research Fellow (Modern Medicine), 2 Class III and 3 Class IV employees.

3. Library :

The total number of books in the library was 2,595.

4. Museum :

Fifty groups of available medicinal herbs, each group consisting of 10 drugs according to the Pharmacological Classification of Charak, are arranged and maintained in the museum. Specimens of minerals and other useful medicines are also maintained. A section on Ayurvedic medicinal preparations is also provided. Work concluded in the Unit is exhibited separately. There are about, 1,000 Ayurvedic specimens, 54 herbarium frames, 7 Original Ayurvedic photo frames, 75 specimen jars of fresh herbs preserved in solution and 16 charts and maps. About 300 specimens have been collected for the herbarium and are classified. A relief map of India showing the distribution of important medicinal plants of India is exhibited in the museum.

5. Work done in the Unit :

(a) Rasa-Shala :

Powders of the fruits of *Ficus glomerata* and of internal bark of *Azadirachta indica* and watery extract of *Ficus glomerata* are being prepared in the Rasa-Shala.

(2) Research Work — (A) Clinical Trials

(B) Pharmacological experimental Work.

(a) The following Clinical Studies have been carried out :

- (i) Clinical trial of *Emblia officinalis* (Amla) as a cough sedative. Capsules of powdered dry-fruit of *Emblia officinalis* were

tried on 9 patients with dry cough. As judged from the reduction in the frequency of coughing bouts and increases in sleeping time the results were encouraging. Further work is in progress.

(ii) Clinical study of *Azadirachta indica* (Neem) in dry eczema. Powdered inner bark of *Azadirachta indica* was administered to patients in capsules and Oil from the seeds of *Azadirachta indica* was used for external application. Satisfactory results were obtained. Further work is in progress.

(iii) Clinical study of *Ficus glomerata* (Udamber) in dyspepsia. Powdered fruit of *Ficus glomerata* administered orally in capsules was found to be effective in 13 Cases of dyspepsia. It had no beneficial effect in patients with peptic ulcer. The work is in progress.

(b) (i) Anti-spasmodic activity of *Ficus glomerata* (Country fig; Hindi-Gular; Gujarati-Umodo).

The watery extract of *Ficus glomerata* was found to inhibit the contractile effect of 5-hydroxy tryptamine on guine pig isolated ileum. This inhibitory effect was dose-related (33.5 to 134 ug/ml.). However, higher dose (134 ug/ml.) produced lesser inhibition of the contractile effect of 5 hydroxytryptamine. The work is in progress.

(ii) Anit-gastric ulcer activity of Tamra Bhasma in rats. Tamra Bhasma obtained from Gujarat Ayurvedic Vikas Mandal, Junagadh was shown to exert anti-gastric ulcer activity against gastric ulcer induced by dexamethasone in female albino rats. The effect was dose-dependent (7.5-120 mg/kg.).

(iii) Hypolipidemic effect of *Balsmodendron mukul* (Shuddha guggula) in rabbit. The work has just started.

6. General Ayurvedic O.P.D. :

During the year, 18,041 old cases and 1,340 new cases were registered in the O.P.D. of the Unit.

5. Training and Placement Activities :

(1) Practical Training :

A number of pre-final and other students were assisted in obtaining practical training at various industrial establishments around Baroda as well as elsewhere in the country.

261 students were deputed for practical training during the summer vacation for a period of approximately six weeks.

24 chemical Industries, 30 pharmaceutical industries and research/testing laboratories, 20 mechanical engineering industries, 11 Electrical engineering industries, 24 electronics industries, 18 metallurgical engineering based industries and 31 textile industries offered training facilities.

In addition, recommendation letters for practical training were issued to a number of students who wished to arrange training on their own.

(2) Employment Opportunities :

(a) Campus Interviews :

Representatives of some well established companies visited the campus for conducting campus interviews/tests of final year students interested in employment. In all 14 Companies visited the Faculty and conducted interviews of 257 students spread over 17 days.

(b) Advertisements from a large number of companies/organizations/laboratories and educational institutions stating their personnel requirements were received. The bio-data of interested students under "Training and Placement" activities were sent to them through this office.

(c) The Indian Navy carried out their preliminary selection of Engineers for entry into Indian Navy under their University entry scheme. Out of 42 students who qualified, 6 students were selected for Services selection Board Interviews.

(3) A Co-operative Course leading to B.Tech. Degree in Mechanical, Electrical and Metallurgical Engineering under the modified pattern, continued during the year under report. This programme has been proved successful for employment.

The apprenticeship (amended) act of Government of India encompasses sandwich pattern of course as per provisions laid down therein.

During the year under report, 3 mechanical, 3 electrical and 3 metallurgical engineering students were admitted to the B.Tech. degree course. Two final phase students qualified for the B.Tech. (Electrical) degree in July, 1979.

(4) *Guidance :*

Students availed themselves of this facility, and sought consultation for employment/training and related problems.

6. Faculty Union Activities :

(I) The Student's Chapter showed during the last year, films of general and technical interest, conducted tours to industries in and around Baroda and arranged technical lectures by eminent professional persons in various fields of engineering.

(II) During the year Faculty Screened 54 films on various subjects of educational interest.

7. Library :

The reading room of the Library has accommodation for 130 Readers. Books for reference are issued between 8.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m. on all working days and also on Sundays and Holidays. Books are issued for reading at home between 11.00 a.m. to 5.15 p.m. on all working days and between 11.00 a.m. and 2.45 p.m. on Saturdays.

Due to shortage of funds the Library has to discontinue many journals. It subscribed to 138 journals. 515 bound journals were added during the year.

8. Institute Consultancy Project :

The following projects were undertaken as Institute Consultancy Projects.

(1) System studies to finalise the 400 KV net work and generation during the Sixth Five Year Plan were completed and preliminary studies for the Seventh Plan were also carried out for Rajasthan and Punjab State Electricity Systems. These Projects are being financed by Rajasthan State Electricity Boards and Punjab State Electricity Boards respectively.

9. Textile and Allied Industries Research Organisation (TAIRO) :

(a) *Tairo Miniature Spinning Plant :*

TAIRO has developed for the first time in India a Miniature Spinning Plant consisting of :

(1) 10" wide Miniature Card (2) drawing frame (3) 4 Spindle Roving Frame (4) 6 Spindle Ring Frame. This is also considered as an improt substitution. Till now this plant was imported from abroad.

This miniature spinning plant is of great assistance to all Institutions training Textile Technology, the investment for the buildings required for housing the currently procured big plants is avoided totally.

(b) *Tairo Web Super Stripper :—*

Following further development works was carried out :—

(1) Spiral groove cut on one of the 3" stripper roller and same roller was fitted in one of the cards to see the performance of stripping.

(2) One 4" dia stripper roller manufactured. 48 flutes were cut on lathe machine on the circumference of the roller. The doffer speed was increased to 16 R.P.M. from 10 R.P.M. and the working of the unit was found very satisfactory.

(3) One 4" stripper roller, one 2.75" dia. redirecting roller and one 2" dia. redirecting roller manufactured and hard chromium plated. The pedestals are manufactured to accommodate these rollers.

(c) *Polymer Lumps :*

To break up the lumps on production basis, jigs were designed, manufactured and fitted on a hand press. It was found that this hand press of TAIRO workshop was successful for eaking lumps, into their required sizes.

(d) *Cotton Cleaning Machine :*

Cotton cleaning machine was installed at Karjan Co-operative Sales Ginning and Pressing Society Limited, in response to the request made by Shri Muljibhai Bhatt. The Working of this machine was found satisfactory.

(e) *Tairo Miniature Multi-Cylinder Sizing Machine and Running off Frame :*

TAIRO has designed the Multi-Cylinder Miniature sizing Machine equipped with all modern controls and running off frame.

(f) *Three Dimensional (Trizxial) Cloth; Inquiry for Development of Machine :*

An inquiry from the Defence Research and Development Laboratory, Hyderabad on the subject was received, and is being processed.

(g) The design work on Tairo Bobbin Stripper is in progress.

(h) *Tairo Trash Analyser :*

There is a good demand for Trash Analyser. It has been licensed to TAICO, BARODA. The average sales is three in two months.

(i) A Proposal estimated to cost 7.5 lakhs rupees for a laboratory plant to assist in rural development has been submitted to the Central Government.

(j) The project "Flatless Card" is under progress.

Faculty of Social Work and Indian Council of Social Welfare established a Child Guidance Clinic in 1973 with a view to providing field work training to students and services to emotionally disturbed children. The services are carried out with the help of a team of experts including psychiatrist, clinical psychologist, speech therapist and social worker. So far, 300 children have been treated in this clinic. The services have also been developed in the area of learning disabilities.

Behavioural and emotional problems of children are taken care for sounder growth and development. The clinic helps parents also for scientific way of socialization, psychogenic factors and social pathology have also been emphasised in guiding problem children's family members. Play Therapy and Counselling help those who are troubled with socio-emotional problems.

CHAPTER XVII—ORIENTAL INSTITUTE

CHAPTER XXII-B—SIR SAYAJIRAO MEMORIAL TRUST I.A.S. TRAINING CENTRE

The I.A.S. Training Centre was established in July, 1977. Since then, the Centre has been imparting training to candidates for the Main Examination of the Union Public Service Commission. The Centre was financed from the Diamond Jubilee Fund and other donations since its inception. From 1-4-1979, the Government of Gujarat has taken over the full liabilities of the Centre.

Four aspirants from Gujarat who had appeared for the Preliminary Examination of the Union Public Service Commission of their own, and who had cleared it successfully, approached the Centre with a request that they may be given intensive training for the main Examination to be held in November, 1979. In accordance with Government of Gujarat Resolution dated 28-5-1979, they were admitted to the Centre for Intensive Training, from August, 1979 to November, 1979 and lectures were arranged in Psychology, Sociology, General Studies, Geography, Indian Politics, Statistics, Role and Impact of Science and Technology in Development of India, and Indian Culture. Five candidates appeared for the Main Examination held by the Union Public Service Commission in November, 1979. Three were declared qualified in the Main Examination and were called for interview.

Programme

Initially 36 trainees were enrolled in the Centre in December, 1979, out of which only 13 trainees attended regularly.

In addition to Quizzes and General Discussion on important news items, lectures were also arranged in different subjects like History, Psychology, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology and General Studies in which Assessment Tests were conducted from time to time.

There are informal sessions for Pre-degree students' Orientation.

CHAPTER XXIV—THE MAHARAJA SAYAJIRAO
UNIVERSITY OF BARODA PRESS1. *Staff*

During the year, the staff of the Press consisted of a Manager, a Deputy Manager, An Assistant Manager, a Head Clerk (Accounts and Stores), One Head Proof-Reader, One Proof Reader, One Copy Holder and a Clerk. There are 42 permanent workers in the Press.

2. *Machinery*

The Press has machinery worth Rs. 2,68,630/- including machinery worth Rs. 1,19,350/- purchased from the grant of the University Grants Commission.

3. *Printing Activities*

During the year 1185 plus 890 examinations papers were printed under conditions of secrecy for the University Examinations. During the year under report, the stationery articles worth Rs. 3,75,581/- were purchased and stationery worth Rs. 4,38,617/- was distributed.

5. University Publication Sales Unit

This University is under the control and supervision of the Manager, University Press. The Unit consists of a Senior Clerk, a Clerk and one Outdoor Work Assistant/Attender. It is working as a bookshop for University Publications. The total sales during the year was Rs. 1,36,387/-.

CHAPTER XXV—THE MAHARAJA SAYAJIRAO UNIVERSITY UNION

1. Executive Committee

For the year 1979-80 Shri D. T. Brahmhatt and Dr. I. D. Bhatt were appointed President and Treasurer of the M. S. University Union. Shri D. T. Brahmhatt resigned in September, 1979 and Prof. Rummy Mistry was appointed as President from the month of October 1979.

General Elections were held in August, 1979 and Shri Satish Desai (Faculty of Arts) was elected as Vice-President and Shri Ashok Patel (Faculty of Technology and Engineering) as General Secretary. Thirty-seven other students were elected as their Faculty/Institution representatives. Prof. H. V. Bhavnani and Shri G. S. Vaswani were nominated by the Syndicate to the Executive Committee.

The first meeting of the Executive Committee was held on Sunday, 2nd September 1979 for the election of the Sectional Secretaries and allocation of various portfolios.

2. Union Activities

(i) Indore Games : (Chess, Badminton and Table Tennis)

Our teams participated at the Inter University Chess and Table Tennis Tournament organised by the Vikram University, Ujjain and Dharwar University, Dharwar respectively during the year 1979-80 and performed well. Besides, the Table Tennis and Badminton teams played at various local and State level tournaments and won several prizes.

(ii) Hiking Club: The club sent a team of about 15 students for Basic Course in Rock Climbing at Mount Abu. Before this the club also undertook a tracking trip to Pavagadh..

The club sent 5 students for Basic Rock Climbing Course at Mount Abu, 2 students for Tracking Course at Manali and 2 students for Snow Climbing Course, at Manali, under the auspices and sponsorship of Hari Ohm Ashram, Nadiad.

(iii) The Emester :

Shri D. H. Mohite was appointed Publisher of the Emester. The first issue of the Emester was published in the Second Term of the year.

(iv) Entertainment Programme :

Three musical evenings were arranged in the Open Air Theatre at the Faculty of Education and Psychology and a Camp Fire was arranged at Union Pavallion Ground during the year. The programmes were open to all.

(v) *University Youth Festival (Campus Harvest '80) :*

Almost all Faculties and Institutions participated in the Inter-Faculty Cultural Competitions i.e. Dramas, Garba/Folk Dances, Group songs, Individual Items etc. For the first time the competitions were held at Gandhi Nagar Gruh.

(vi) *Fun Fair :*

A Fun Fair was arranged on 25th and 26th February, 1980 at Union Pavillion Ground.

(vii) *Debating Society :*

During the year Several trophy debates were conducted.

Shri Ramesh Madhvan and Shri Gurunamsingh Kohli of the Faculty of Technology and Engineering represented our University at All India Inter University Hindi and English Debate Competition held on 10th December, 1979 at Varanasi. Shri Sandip A. Patel, of Faculty of Commerce, represented the University at Kamalnayan Bajaj Memorial Inter University Seminar held on 19th and 20th January, 1980 at Wardha.

CHAPTER—XXVI GENERAL EDUCATION CENTER

1. *Facilities*

Facilities are available at the Centre for Students of the University for Self-learning through Audio-Visual Aids for Practical Art Activities and Appreciation, as well as for knowing Electrical Gadgets, their use and minor repairs.

2. *Programmes*

The activities under various programmes at the General Education Centre during the year were as under :

(1) *Art Activities, Appreciation and Film :*

During the academic year 1979-80, totally fifteen students were registered from different Faculties. Students worked with materials like Clay, Poster Paints Coloured papers, Plaster and found objects. They created colour designs, clay models, box sculptures and batiks. Slides were shown for Appreciation of Painting and Sculpture. Films from department as collection were also projected for the group.

(2) *Speakers and Writers Club :*

During this academic year 16 students for Speakers Club and fourteen students for Writers Club were registered from different Faculties. Their main interest was in Inter-Faculty and Inter-University debates. Some of them wrote articles and expressed their opinions through creative writing.

(3) *Dramatic Club :*

During this year nineteen students were registered for the Dramatics Club. They were given instruction on various topics relating to Stages, Lighting and Acting. They were also invited to see the performance.

(4) *Listeners Club :*

In the year six students was registered for the Listeners Club. They listen to tapes of some well-known people.

(5) *Electrical Gadgets Club :*

There were four students registered in the Electrical Gadgets Club from different Faculties during this year. They were given instruction on various topics relating to Radio, Electrical Bells, Tape Recorders, Volt Meters, Tube-lights, Fuses etc.

CHAPTER XXVII—STUDENTS' WELFARE ACTIVITIES

1. Halls of Residence

The University being a residential university makes constant efforts to increase and improve residential accommodation for its students. At its start in 1949, the University had accommodation for 200 men in rented buildings. There was no hostel accommodation for women students. There are now 12 Halls of Residence for men and 4 Halls of Residence for women.

The general policy of the University is to distribute students from various Faculties in different halls so that every hall has students from different Faculties. At the end of the year under report 2,588 men and 667 women were in residence in different halls as against 2,551 and 659 respectively in 1978-79. The Appendix-XI gives the break-up of these students by Halls and Institutions.

In the men's Halls of Residence, there is one Honorary Warden and in the women on paid full-time Superintendent to look after the residents. The administration of the Halls was carried on with the advice of the Advisory Committee of the Halls of Residence and Wardens' Committee.

All the Halls have been provided with common rooms which are generally used as Library-cum-reading rooms also. The Halls are also provided with furnished Visitors' rooms. Indoor games are also provided in the Halls.

The Chief Warden's Office has a staff of 9 class III and 2 class IV employees.

The Central Committee and the following three Sub-Committees were formed: (i) Inter-Hostel Food Committee, (ii) Inter-Hostel Sports Committee and (iii) Inter-Hostel Entertainment Committee. The Chief Warden, Halls of Residence was the Chairman of the Central Committee.

Students are also members on the above Committees. Apart from these Committees each Hall of Residence has its own Executive Committee composed of the student members duly elected by the resident students of the Halls. These Committees worked under the guidance of their respective Wardens. Students participated actively in matters pertaining to the affairs of the Hall except finance.

2. University Health Centre

During the year the staff of the Health Centre consisted of the Medical Officer, one Nurse, one Sanitary Inspector, one Compounder, one Laboratory-cum-X-Ray Technician, one Part-time Clerk, three Hamal-cum-Sweepers, one Honorary Physician, one Surgeon and one Lady Gynaecologist.

Halls of Residence were visited for inspecting maintenance of sanitation and hygiene in both hostels and kitchens twice a year.

A "Maternity and Child Care Centre" under the guidance of Rotary Club of Baroda worked in the Health Centre on every Thursday for 2 hours in the morning. It dealt with the vaccination programme and ante-natal advice to the expectant mothers. It also dealt with family welfare advice.

The Health Centre provides preventive and curative services for Malaria to students, members of the staff and their families.

New entrants to the University were given a Medical Check-up by the Medical Inspection Board in S.S.G. Hospital. Out of the total 5,486 entrant students scheduled for Medical check-up, 3,722 (68%) reported. Out of the total examined, 1,548 (41.59%) were recommended follow-up treatment to be taken either from the Health Centre. Specialists of S.S.G. Hospital or the family doctors for various disorders viz. skin, eye, ear, nose, throat, heart etc. Out of 1,548 follow-up students 1,170 students (76%) completed their follow-up treatment.

During the year the total attendance of the patients at the Health Centre Clinic was 35,217 (8,287 students and 26,930 were the members of the staff and their families). The average daily attendance has been 117 during the year. The Centre remained open all hours for emergency and the doctors on duty attended cases of emergency in the Halls of Residence and the residence of the staff members.

Rs. 11,024-15 were collected from patients during the year.

The total number of Laboratory investigations was 1,463. The total number of fluoroscopy examination was 517.

The mess servants were called at the Health Centre for their general check-up.

Rs. 33,278-22 were paid against re-imbusement amount to the University staff and their dependents for medical treatment.

The women student's common room and the Non-Resident Student's Centre were built with financial assistance from the University Grants Commissions and the State Government.

A canteen is attached to each of the three Common Rooms. There are facilities for indoor games such as carrom, draught, chess, table tennis, etc. and reading material like daily newspapers, periodicals and small collection of books. Committees consisting of the members of the teaching staff look after the upkeep and arrangements of the rooms. The rooms are also used for meetings of the Student's Association, Socials, Indoor games and tournaments.

The National Service Scheme, M. S. University of Baroda is sponsored by the Ministry of Education, India and Social Welfare, Government of India and Department of Education, Government of Gujarat.

(1) Objectives :

The major objectives of N.S.S. are to provide opportunities to University students to develop their capacities for nation-building tasks during their leisure and in vacations.

(2) Organisation :

The organisation of N.S.S. consisted of one Director, one Programme Co-ordinator, one Office Secretary, one Field Organiser, 12 N.S.S. Programme Leaders, 2 Office Assistants, a Driver and 2 Peons.

(5) Special Feature :

The speciality of N.S.S. Programme of Baroda University is that the N.S.S. Units are not allotted to the Colleges, but the whole programme is organised centrally at the University level. The projects are organised on the basis of students interests.

(6) Detailed Project Report of the N.S.S. Regular Activities 1979-80

The National Service Scheme : for its regular activities during the academic year of 1979-80 had 18 projects; covering various social services fields spread over whole city of Baroda. The newly enrolled 1401 students were involved variety of social service projects which are as follows :

(i) Action Oriented Survey Project :

The project aimed at (1) increasing awareness of the student community towards various problems of Baroda City and also (2) at training student volunteers for undertaking surveys to identify problems. The activities were divided among the student group, who involved themselves in public contact, institutional visits, preparing of traffic posters for public guidance etc.

(ii) Construction and Aforestation Project :

Aiming at inculcating respect for manual labour and creating awareness regards importance of flora and fauna among the student community, the project activity began with "Three Plantation" Campaign. This was done with the help of the Forest Department in the compounds of various institutions and gardens.

The student group had visits to public places and institutions as a part of their education. Alongwith this, educational films were also shown.

(iii) Creative Activity Project :

The project aims at developing creative and socially useful hobbies among the students volunteers with a view utilizing it for the benefit of the weaker section of the society. The project is supervised by an expert from the field of fine arts. The students volunteers are taught to work with Colour Designs, Printing, Weaving, Matting and Paper activities, Stencil making etc. These methods are in the later stage used for making creative articles to teach them to the students of the Municipal Primary Schools of Baroda.

(iv) Cultural Activity Project :

The project was reconstituted this year aiming at bringing out the hidden cultural talents in the student volunteers by providing them opportunities and develop it to higher levels. Their items were staged at the following places :

- (1) S.S.G. Hospital—for inward patients.
- (2) Workshop for the Blind—Subhanpura.
- (3) Rural areas.
- (4) Faculty of Social Work.
- (5) University Youth Festival.

(v) Education Guidance Project :

As the name suggests, the project aimed at involving student volunteers in various educational activities in the the community and educational institutions. The activities were :—(a) Library service groups; (b) Guiding the general public in making the use of the transport facility in the city of Baroda as part of

general education programme; (c) To help the school-going children of specific areas in their academic needs at convenient hours; (d) Guiding young school children in observing traffic rules.

(vi) *Family life Education Project :*

This project involves students of the Faculty of Home Science who are able to put their class room knowledge into practice. The project volunteers involve themselves in surveying a rural area, and on the basis of their findings, introduce various programmes on health and sanitation, education, nutrition and family welfare. They also work in the slum areas of the Baroda where they provide vaccination and inoculation facilities for children of 0-6 years. The volunteers were of help at the Ayurvedic College and S.S.G. Hospital in assisting the patients in different ways.

(vii) *Rural Health and Medical Care Project :*

The above project is supervised by a professional person in the field of medicine. The activities of the project are carried out largely by the student volunteers of the Medical College. The project aims at providing (1) a practical laboratory to the students for using their class room knowledge; (2) medical services to the weaker sections of society and rural areas.

The students took up the following activities :—(a) 'Ankhol' village was adopted for health survey, health check-up and treatment to the patient of the village. This programme proved a success and was extended to the nearby village, Amodar.

(b) Two major slums of Baroda City were adopted for diagnostic and curative services.

(c) Health Surveys were conducted during camps of other groups. Diagnostic and Curative work is undertaken weekly during the camp under the guidance of the Medical Staff.

(d) Volunteers also participated in Flood Relief work.

(viii) *Health Service Project :*

This project aims at (a) utilizing the knowledge of trained the student in the field of medicine. (b) utilizing the student resource in collecting drugs and medicines. The students collect free medicine samples from the medical practitioners of the city. These are stored at the Drug Bank run by medical students at S.S.G. Hospital. The samples are sorted into various categories and distributed to the needy patients of the S.S.G. Hospital.

(ix) *Hospital Service Project :*

This project is taken up at four different hospitals in the City of Baroda, namely :—(1) S.S.G. Hospital, (2) Railway Hospital, (3) Jambhai Hospital, (4) T.B. Hospital.

The objectives of the project are : (a) training the student volunteers for organising social service programmes at a hospital; (b) to run a mobile library at the hospital as a means of recreation to the indoor patients; (c) to provide information and guidance to patients etc.

(x) *Mass Education and Campaign Project :*

The project aims at taking through campaign mass level education about problems of people at large and to solve them by launching various programmes such as National Small Saving Scheme, Family Planning etc.

(xi) *School Service Project :*

This project aims at involving student volunteers in activities of school-going children for supplementary and cocurricular education. The Central Library has a full-fledged library in Baroda city catering to the needs of adults, women and children. The student volunteers of the project help library administration in (a) general section, (b) Mahila section and (c) Children section in providing effective library services.

A batch of student volunteers visited the primary schools of Baroda city, met teachers, principals and discussed the children's needs in. Co-curricular and extra curricular activities.

(xii) *Project for Disabled People :*

The objectives of the project are :

(a) To train student volunteers in Braille for preparing literature for the use of blind children.

(b) To assist blind students of the University for their academic achievements.

(c) To help the blind students of primary and secondary schools in reading and writing.

To achieve the above objectives : Students were placed in institution for the blind in the city. They read stories; taught lessons and arranged sport programmes for the inmates of the agency. The volunteers also helped five individuals to prepare their college notes and also works as writers for these individuals, during their examinations. They participated in the 'Fund Collection Campaign' on the 13 September, 1979 i.e. Day for the Blind.

(xiii) *Play Centre and Recreation :*

This programme aimed at (a) bringing about the realization regarding the importance of sports in the life of young persons: (b) starting play centres in different schools, institutions and community centres.

(xiv) *Village Development Project :*

The objective is to involve university youth in a number of activities in community development in the villages. The student volunteers go to village Vemali of Baroda Taluka and participate in educational programmes, healthcare activities etc. and conduct studies.

The volunteers organised a cultural programme in aid of fund erection of Balwadi building in the village. Alembic Group Industries have adopted this village for Integrated Rural Development Programmes and they manage follow-up activities.

(xv) *Slum Improvement Project :*

The objectives of the project were :

(1) To help the students to understand problems of slum dwellers with a view to finding out solution for them.

(2) To start 'Play Centres' in the community.

(3) To provide them electric light facility with the help of Municipal Corporation.

(4) To start 'adult education' centres .

The group tried to achieve these objectives by creating an awareness among the community people.

(xvi) *Adult Education and Community Service Project :*

The University has undertaken a massive project of adult education under NAEP programmes of the Government of India since 1979. The volunteers of Adult Education and Community Service Project are imparted special training to work as Adult Educators. Such trained volunteers conducted regular adult education classes in Baroda city. They also conducted surveys and motivated the adults in the community to take advantage of the programme.

(xvii) *This is a new project with a focus on :*

(1) Documenting factual information about N.S.S. activities and Camping and experience of the participants.

(2) Trainings students in writing and in interviewing people. Twenty selected and interested student volunteers were enrolled in this project.

(xviii) *Padra College Project :*

This project is undertaken by the M. K. Amin Arts and Science College and College of Commerce at Padra. The project involves student volunteers who work under the guidance of the staff members of this college. The major activities of the project were :

(a) Campus Development through cleaning the ground of the college, used for sports and games.

(b) Cleaning the Road, leading to the college from the city.

(c) Tree plantation programme to celebrate 15th August.

(d) Blood Donation Campaign organised by N.S.S. Student volunteers at which 33 bottles of blood was collected.

(e) Book Collection Camp to collect books for poor students and novels for the local people.

(f) One day cleanliness Camp at Goriad where 300 metre of village hood was cleaned up. Seventy-seven students participated in this activity.

(7) *Flood Relief Work :*

The student volunteers participated in the rally organised in the Alkapuri area to collect food grains, old clothes etc, for the flood affected people of Morvi.

The student volunteers under the leadership of N.S.S. Programme Co-ordinator, participated in the camp held for 10 days immediately after the floods for relief work at Morvi. Students engaged themselves in debris and mud removal etc.

(8) *Adult Education Programme*

The adult education programme of the university was one year old in 1979-80. It was celebrated by organising a seminar under the chairmanship of D.A.O. at which papers discussing its importance, people's participation in the programme etc. were presented. The seminar was followed by a cultural programme.

(9) *Special Camping Programme*

Over and above the regular activities the National Service Scheme, M. S. University of Baroda also organised 17 Camps under Special Camping Programme. 14 of these camps were organised at various villages of Baroda District and 3 others were special flood-relief camps at Morvi. 28 Camp Organizers who were teaching staff members and Senior Student volunteers of various Faculties/Institutions of the University involved the student volunteers in interesting activities and guided the whole programme effectively.

The student campers achieved physical targets of construction of 21 huts/houses for landless labourers, 215 Bavla type latrines, 3 P.R.A. type latrines, 255 Soak-pits, 326 Smokeless ovens, 335 Chokadies, 188 Ventilators and 35 Paniyaras. They also dug a trench of 500' x 2' x 3' measurement for a lift-irrigation project. The student campers participating in forest camps prepared 1000 meters of terracing on a hillock. Miscellaneous works of kotar bunding and land reclamation were also undertaken as per the needs in the camps.

Over and above physical work, educational activities, public contacts, surveys and recreational programmes were also undertaken.
